Nursery This week it has been Math Challenge Week in School. We have been doing lots of different activities that have incorporated different mathematical concepts counting, number recognition, shape recognition, patterns and positional language. We have been drawing patterns in coloured sand and making patterns with shapes. The children have been counting various autumn images and finding the corresponding numeral. We have also been doing lots of rhyming, spotting the image that didn't rhyme with the others.. The children have created beautiful Poppy field pictures to commemorate Remembrance Day.
