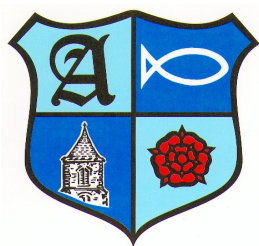

Nursery We have been celebrating Father's day in Nursery this week, the children invited their Dad's or Grandad's to Nursery to see what they can do. Very busy fun mornings were had by all; through working hard in Literacy, playing our favourite PE and math games outdoors and playing with all the dads on the equipment. Thank You for making it so much fun for all the Children they haven't stopped talking about it!

Reception This week in Reception we have been writing a new ending to The Gingerbread Man. In computing we have been learning about how to program a BeeBot . In RE we have been learning that Jesus is our friend and what qualities make a good friend.

Year 1 Firstly Well Done to all of year 1 for working hard on their phonics screening we are very proud. This week, we have been learning to tell the time to half past and created some beautiful artwork inspired by our poem *The Caterpillar*.

Year 2 This week in Year 2, we have had a very busy week of quizzes, the year 2 team are very proud of Year 2, they have all worked exceptionally hard. In Science, we have observed our sunflowers, some of us have little seedlings already. In PE, we have worked as a team to work on our throwing and catching skills.

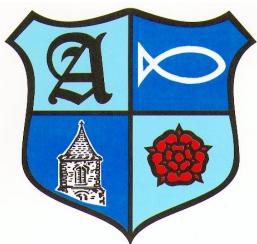

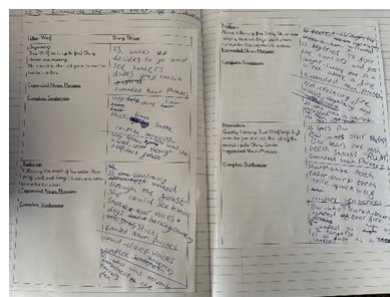

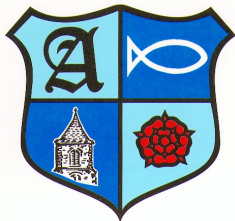

This coming Sunday, the Church celebrates the great feast of The Most Holy Trinity. This Feast gives us further insight into God's true nature, which is one of love.

Human language can never fully explain the mystery of God which is beyond our total understanding. However, Jesus teaches us that, although there is only one God, there are three Persons in God – the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. So we speak of God as the Trinity of three Persons. 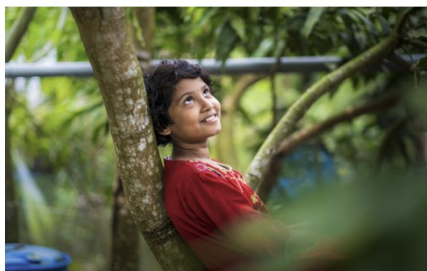

Our coffee mornings will be held on the last Thursday of the month 9am-10am in the KS1 building.

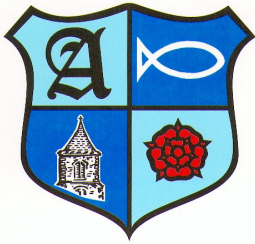
