Dear parents, carers, grandparents and parishioners,

You will have noticed that we have numerous contractors on site as the planned building works continue. Currently, the perimeter fence is being upgraded. 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Curriculum News

Reception This week Reception received a postcard from Brunel Bear- he was in France. We learnt all about France including their famous landmarks and French artists. Brunel then visited Italy. We have learnt all about the key landmarks there and the cuisine. In our music lesson we compared French and Italian songs and learnt that music is universal! We ended the week by making our own Pizzas - They were delicious!

Year 1 This week in Year 1 the children have continued to learn about the Great Fire of London. They have worked together collaboratively to make their very own class book all about the Great Fire of London. They included a contents page, subheadings with information, glossary and a front cover. In maths we have been learning all about comparing objects and numbers to 50 using language such as more than less than and equal to.

Year 2 This week the children have started a new unit of work in Maths - Money. They have been recognising coins and notes and combining different coins. In English they have continued to delve deeper into the story of 'The Pirate Cruncher' by sequencing the story, exploring the characters and identifying the features of the text. In the Computing sessions the children have been using the skills of effective searching to research different pirate boats. Their results are going to inform their DT project - to design and make a land and sea boat with an axel and a chassis. Watch out for more pirate adventures next week!

Year 3 In Year 3 this week we have continued our work on the Romans, looking at the invasions led by Julius Caesar as well as Pompeii. Our work on Pompeii will lead into some beautiful artwork using paint and mosaics in later weeks. In RE we have been studying the church's liturgical calendar and how the different seasons are represented by colour.

Year 5 This week Year 5 have been learning about the earth. The children have enjoyed finding out about the different theories regarding people in the past thinking that the earth was flat!

Year 6 For Art we have researched the work of Auguste Edouart who is a French silhouette artist. We have begun to create our own silhouette art using charcoal.
