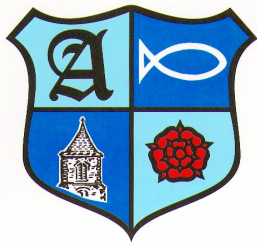

Curriculum News

Nursery We have been very busy this week discussing the word 'Sorry' in Nursery and how it is not just a word but that we can show we are 'Sorry' in different ways. The children have thought have lots of different ways we can do this and have displayed understanding of the different emotions that we feel. We have discussed how we are a Nursery Family and that we all help each other to ensure everyone's happiness.

Reception This week we have been building on our learning of 9 and 10 and we have been learning number bonds to 10. In art we have been learning how to print using different tools and in music we have been using instruments to enhance stories.

Year 1 This week, we've been writing our own fantasy stories! Also, we've enjoyed exploring Bee Bots and using them to create an instructional video for our computing project!

Year 2 In year 2 the children have been working super hard! In English the children have been writing their own animal chapter sequel to 'The Owl Who Was Afraid Of The Dark' using a different nocturnal animal. In maths the children have been looking at different capacities and mass. As well as this, the children took part mini-beast hunt. In science the children have been learning about different mini-beats and their habitats.

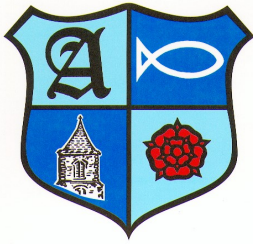
Year 3 This week, Year 3 have been creating a Dragon Dance based on the Chinese New Year story of Nian. They have created masks and used the pentatonic scale (CDEGA) to create melodies and combined percussion to create a dramatic sound.

Year 4 Year 4 have enjoyed learning new skills in hockey this week. This week both classes had a visit from Mr Farrimond who taught us about coding. We enjoyed using our coding skills, with loops to get Pie Eater to move. We have continued with our 'With You Always' programme in preparation for our Reconciliation.

Year 5 Year 5 are currently doing a 3-week block of Bikeability, where we learn to ride a bike safely and responsibly - we have learnt a lot about the Highway Code and how to keep our bikes roadworthy. In Maths we have been learning about area and perimeter - we have remembered perimeter by our school perimeter fence. In Science we have been comparing the life-cycles of flowering plants and different animals. We found it very hard.

Year 6 This week Year 6 have been leading on the whole school Easter egg collection. They will help teachers and the PTA to create raffle prizes for the whole school...so watch this space!





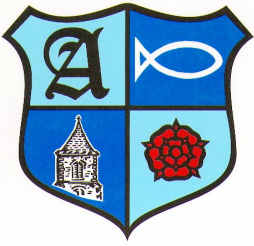

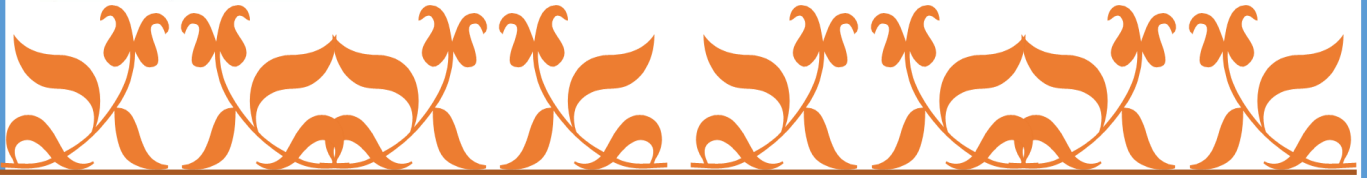

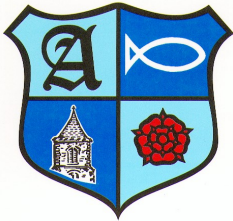

THE WORD Wednesday **SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL** **A Gift to You & Your Family from Your Catholic School**

Wednesday 12th March 2025

Dear Parents and Carers,

There are times when we all need encouraging: that is, to be inspired with courage and to have our hope renewed, especially when we are going through difficult times.

The snapshot of Jesus' glory in this Sunday's Gospel was an encouragement to the three disciples. For the first time they received a glimpse of the awesome divinity of Jesus. But soon they would go through difficult times and see Jesus crucified.

So beforehand, God tells them to listen to Jesus and allows them to see Jesus for who he really is. Following Jesus isn't easy: it never was. But if, like the disciples, we too listen to Jesus, we will experience the encouragement that God offers freely to each one of us - today.

Enjoy exploring this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is **ENCOURAGEMENT**.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 16th March 2025

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the appearance of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing over (his death, his resurrection and his ascension) which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw Jesus' glory and the two men standing with him. As Moses and Elijah were leaving, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." As he spoke, a cloud overshadowed them; and the disciples were afraid. Then a voice came from the cloud saying, "This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him".

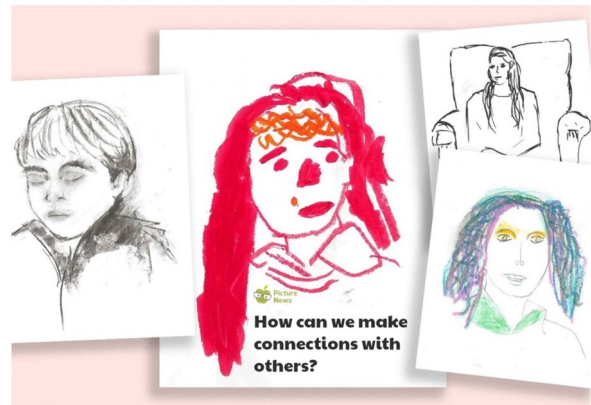

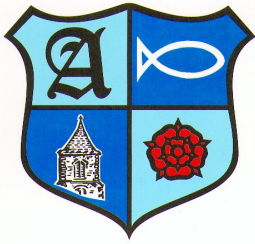

Temporary Closure of St Anne's Church

Message from Fr Godric

As promised, here is an update on the on-going building work on our church tower. Following further investigation by a structural engineer an issue has arisen which is in the process of being resolved. In the meantime, it is necessary to close the church temporarily and arrangements are as follows: Friday evening: There will be no Stations of the Cross. On Saturday there will be no Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and no Reconciliation. The two weekend Masses will be held in the Pastoral Centre Hall and Sunday Mass will not be streamed. As capacity in the hall is less than in the church, if you feel it to be more convenient, then a reminder that Sunday Mass at St Elizabeth's is at 9.am. The church will not be open for quiet prayer on Sunday afternoon. Eucharistic Ministers who take Holy Communion outside of Mass will be able to access the church through the Sacristy door. Also, due to capacity in the hall this Sunday's Church Parade is cancelled.

Thank you for your understanding. I will continue to provide updates as often as possible.
