After completing their independent story writing,



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Curriculum News

Nursery We have been reading 'Don't hog the hedge' in Nursery this week, we have been looking at the different animals that are getting to ready to hibernate. The children have discussed the different emotions that Hattie the Hedgehog felt in the story and have enjoyed creating their own hedgehogs using different resources. To celebrate Mental Health Day this week we read the story 'When a jelly had a wobble', the children have embraced that we are all different, but we can still befriends. Star of the Week: Nora R. Reception This week in Reception we have been sequencing our instructions for making bread. Some of us have even had a go at writing a short caption for these too. In math's we have been comparing quantities and using the language of more and fewer. We have also been learning about animal habitats and have created our own habitats for different animals that hibernate.

Year 1- This week the children have strarted a new English topic on 'Instructions'. The children have identified what makes a good set of instructions by using bossy verbs, time connectives and saying them in the correct order. They loved following instructions and making their own jam sandwich (especially the final step of eating it!). As part of this, in D&T the children made their own fruit kebabs and wrote their own set of instructions on how to make it. They were brilliant at remembering their time connectives and bossy verbs!

Year 3 "We have enjoyed reading a variety of poetry and learning such poetic skills as alliteration, onomatopoeia and rhyme. We have begun gathering words and phrases for own poems. In Maths we continue to look at addition and subtraction across the tens and hundreds barriers and in Science we have learnt what endoskeletons, exoskeletons and hydrostatic skeletons are. In RE we are now beginning to look at belonging and baptisms. Next Wednesday we are looking forward to having our Rock And Roll Day where all of Year 3 will be dressing up as characters from the last 70 years and learning 50s dances."

Year 4 We have had another great week! We have looked at the results of our science experiment-orange juice and blackcurrant juice did the most damage-yuk! Check out twitter for the photographs. We are all continuing to work hard at our swimming lessons.

Year 5 Year 5 have been comparing different types of animal's gestation period to their life expectancy in Science this week. For Mental Health Day, they have explored what Mental Health is and the types of methods we can use to help us feel calm and cope with times we feel sad or worried.

Year 6 The children have worked so hard this week and have designed some very creative spring rolls! We're looking forward to making them altogether next Tuesday. We also had a really good discussion on World Mental Health Day, focusing on how we can look after ourself as well as others. The children were very thoughtful.
