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Curriculum News

Nursery The Sparkling Stars have been reading 'Wake up time on Bumble Farm' and discussing the different animals that live on a farm. The Giggle Tots have been reading 'Oh Dear', helping Buster find the eggs on the farm. The children were very excited this week because their mummies came in to read with them and have a biscuit, it was lovely to see everyone enjoying reading together, lots of smiles and giggles! **Star of the Week - Marie AR Mission Statement - Frazer Q & Molly H**

Reception This week in reception we have been caring for our 8 chicks. We have learned about the lifecycle of a chick and ordered pictures to go with the process. We have created our own versions of The Enormous Turnip, we used our story map from last week- our writing was amazing! In maths we have been continuing our work on 9 and 10.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been looking at rhyming words in our animal poems. We are rewriting our own version of the poem the 'Animals Went in Two by Two' by using our understanding of syllables to help. In maths we have been learning about numbers beyond 50 and how we can represent these in tens and ones. In science we have been learning about reptiles and amphibians.

Year 2 In year 2 this week the children have been writing a leaflet to advertise the 'Bug Hotels' that they designed after the 'mini' safari around the school grounds. In English, they have been reading the poem The Owl and the Pussycat and sequencing the story and continued to learn about quarters and thirds in maths.

Year 3 Year 3 have been starting to create electronic book reviews for the book 'Funny bones' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg in Computing. While in English, the children have been creating amazing descriptions for our focus novel, 'Max the Detective Cat.'

Year 4 We have demonstrated some excellent skills in PE this week- we looked at different types of rolls in gymnastics and we worked on our attacking and defending skills in hockey. We are continuing our 'With You Always' programme to prepare for our Sacraments and have offered thoughtful answers in discussions. In maths, we continue to be resilient as we learn about decimal numbers and make links to our prior learning about fractions.

Year 5 We have been learning all about the life-cycle of plants and how they photosynthesise to create their food in the leaves. In Maths we were learning how to calculate the perimeter and the area of shapes and in English we were studying a beautiful book called the Great Kapok Tree, which has some gorgeous illustrations - it is well-worth getting if only for the pictures of the Amazon Rainforest flora and fauna.

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- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection

- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months.
