#### Nursery

During Nursery this week we have been exploring natural Autumn Resources and talking about the changes that are happening around us. We have used the Autumnal resources to explore different mathematical concepts such as patterns, sorting and counting. We have also created our own Autumn tree, we mixed paints to create colours of Autumn using our hands and by painting leaves to make leaf prints. We went on a Autumn walk to find leaves of all different colours, and conkers and have been using our senses to explore them. We are continuing to develop our new friendships in Nursery.
