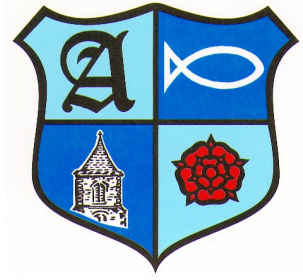




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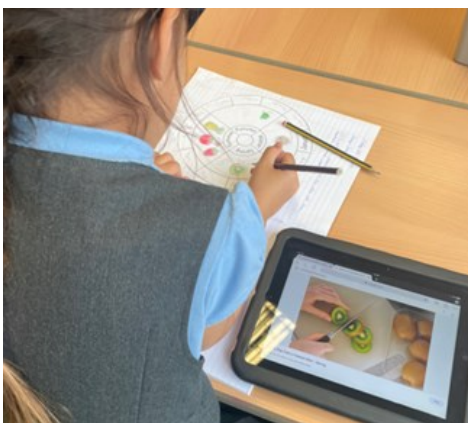

For Science and PSHE we have continued our topic of Teeth by looking at why it is important to clean them carefully. We used disclosing tablets to highlight any plaque left after brushing.

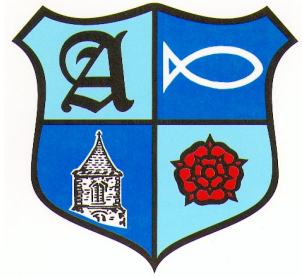


To start our Design Technology topic, we have begun by researching seasonal foods in the UK. This will help us to design our healthy meal.

## Curriculum News

**Nursery** The children have all settled into our Nursery Family life, they have enjoyed exploring their new Nursery and the lovely resources. We have been very busy learning each others names, making friends, playing games and beginning our learning journey! This week we have been talking about Ourselves this has included: what our names are and who gave us our names, why we have names, looking at ourselves in mirrors and creating images of ourselves and talking about what we like to do.

**Reception** We have super week this week in Reception! We started PE this week and we all listened very carefully when we had our first tennis session. We have read the story Ruby's Worry and we have made our own worry monsters. We talked about what a worry was and how we can overcome them.

**Year 1** This week the children have continued our English theme 'All About Me'. They have completed their 'All About Me' booklets, writing about their hobbies, emotions, and families this week. We have continued learning all about place value and have been counting on from given numbers as well as looking at the written form of a number. We loved having our first tennis lesson of the year and learning about the parts of the body and their uses in Science. In Religion we have continued to look how God loves and cares for us all by looking at psalms. We ended the week by celebrating the start of the school year with the whole school family in church.

**Year 2** Mrs Bell and Mrs Preston are so proud of the children this week. They have worked so hard throughout this busy week. 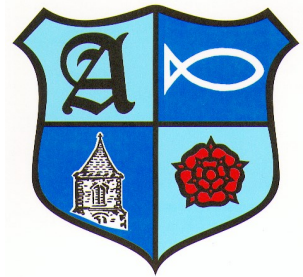

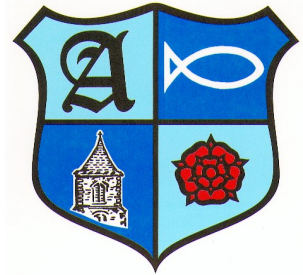
## New noticeboard outside the Office Reception
