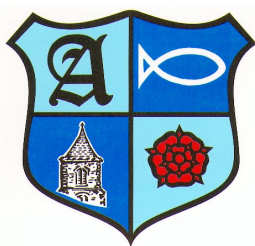
Gas Works Prescott Road—Delays expected

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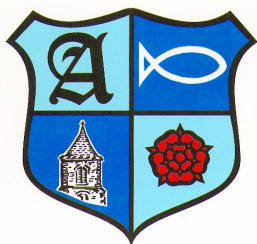

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Curriculum News



Nursery We have been discussing the lifecycle of a caterpillar this week, we have enjoyed the story 'The Hungry Caterpillar' and have been learning the song 'Tiny Caterpillar on a leaf'. The children have learnt about the different stages and have created pictures to depict this. We also noticed the patterns on Butterflies wings, so we made our own butterfly paintings and were amazed with the results.

Reception This week in Reception we have been learning how to subtract in maths. In Literacy we have been writing speech bubbles and recording our voices to animate a picture from 'The Way Back Home' by Oliver Jeffers. In RE we have been celebrating good news and sharing this with our class.

Year 1 This week, we have explored the changes made since the Titanic, focusing on safety improvements and the experiences of different passenger classes. In Maths, we began learning about fractions, and in English, we started looking at how to write clear instructions.

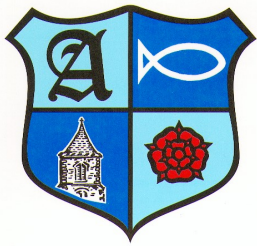
Year 2 This week in Year 2 has been a busy one. In English, we have created our own riddle based on fruit. In Maths, we have moved on to telling the time and we have looked at half past and o'clock. We have also had two dress rehearsals for our play. The children in Year 2 are very excited to share this with parents next week. A highlight of the week though was the visit from Woodlands Farm and the goats!

Year 3 The Year 3 children have been practising how to do a running stitch ready for making their own bag in D&T. They have also been experiments with magnets in Science, exploring their strengths. While in Maths they have been recalling the value of pounds and pence and identifying amounts of money.

Year 4 Year 4 have impressed us this week whilst writing their non-chronological reports about Matthew Henson. They have used their research and plans, producing excellent pieces of work. In PE, we have worked on sprinting, hurdles and throwing skills in our Athletics topic.

Year 5 We have been learning about the great process of democracy in Ancient Greece and how they voted (male citizens only) on every law and decision for each city. They even voted yearly to ostracise one person for 10 years - they were sent away and banished from Athens for 10 years - if we had that in Britain, who would you choose? In Science we have been testing friction and seeing how important it is to our walk through life - literally. We have also managed to hit a few hole-in-ones in our golf lessons - watch out Rory McIlroy.

Year 6 We're so very proud of the Year 6 children this week. SATs week can be tricky but our children came into school with a positive and determined attitude to do their best. As teachers we couldn't ask for anything more! Well done to each and every one of them.
