## **Curriculum News**

**Nursery** We have been reading the story 'Ten little lights', the children have expressed their ideas and thoughts about how the characters were feeling in the story and why. The children have worked together to build the house from the story and have re enacted the story with the characters. We have also been exploring different directions that we can move when travelling, the children have been very busy problem solving with the bee - bots making them move along the road without falling off!

**Reception** In Reception this week we have been learning about animals who live in the Arctic. Children have written superb facts about these animals. In Expressive Art and Design, we have been leaning about Kal Barteski and her artwork about polar bears. We have used her work to inspire us to create line drawings of polar bears.

**Year 1** This week, we have been writing non-fiction booklets on the Great Fire of London. We also started exploring LS Lowry and his unique painting style. Additionally, everyone enjoyed using their computer skills to create lists.

**Year 2** In Year 2 this week the children have continued reading George's Marvellous Medicine, collecting exciting new vocabulary to write and describe their own marvellous medicine. The children have also been learning about the amazing Florence Nightingale, sequencing and discussing the significance events of her life. In Maths the children have finished their unit on Money after learning to make variations of the same amount and calculating change. They have been absolute superstars!

#### Year 3 See Spotlight

**Year 4** Year 4 have acted in a very mature manner this week as we have discussed the Slave Trade and the way people were treated as slaves. We have used atlases and globes to locate the countries involved in the trading of slaves. In PE we have continued to learn the rules of Quidditch, developing our skills as we go. In art we have enjoyed learning about the meanings behind the colours and patterns used in African Tribal art.

Year 5 Space, space, nothing but space... That is what we wish school was all about! Space is amazing - we have found out all about the Red Planet (Mars) and the rovers that have explored it. Did you know that it is red, because of the dusty surface, which is made out of iron oxide - this means it is literally a ball of rusty iron (like Mr Batchelor's car). In Maths we have been learning the bus stop method of division - we are great at it!

**Year 6** Year 6 have continued their work on silhouette art this week by looking at examples and choosing what makes them stand out. We've continued to focus on The Wizard of Oz focusing on comparing and contrasting the book and film versions. There have been some interesting interpretations of the Scarecrow character!
