In Quidditch, we have been learning about the different positions in the team. We have practised the different skills and then applied them in games.





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Curriculum News

Nursery We have been Spring Scientists in Nursery this week, we went to Willow Woods to find Percy and meet all his friends that live in the woods. We worked as a team to move the logs to look underneath and then used a Minibeast checklist to mark off all his friends that we found. It was lots of fun and we found many different minibeasts. The children have been using their phonic knowledge to identify minibeasts by their initial letter sounds or by clues that were given.

Reception In Reception this week we have been creating our own artwork inspired by Gaudi, we have used college and mosaic to create space themed art. In Literacy we have learned how to write speech bubbles and we then brought them to life by recording our own voices! In Maths we have been learning about shape, we have been rotating shapes to create pictures.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been finishing our information texts on the Titanic. In maths we have been looking at finding the quarter of a shape and an amount. In Re we have started our other faiths week on Islam. We started our flower sculptures in Art.

Year 2 This week in Year 2 we have been writing a non-chronological report about the mythical creatures from our stories. In Maths we have come to the end of our unit on reading and representing data. In R.E we have been learning about the faith is Islam. We looked at a Muslim house hold and how Muslim's pray.

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Stay safe in the water this summer!





Where possible, swim at a lifeguarded beach, organised session or supervised venue.

At a pool, check the depths, these can change significantly from one part of the pool to another.

Is the water clear and the area well-kept and free from tripping hazards?

Stay together Always swim with an adult

The first thing to teach your child is **never** to enter the water without your express permission

Younger children should always swim with an adult and adults must always supervise children in the water at all times.

Most drownings take place when adults are present.

Teach your child that if they fall into water unexpectedly they should float on their back by looking up at the sky and staying still. Drowning is Then either call for help or swim to safety.

Call 999

Don't enter the water to help

If you see someone in trouble, tell somebody or call 999. Ask for the Fire Service at inland water sites and the Coastguard at the beach.

Throw something that floats (eg a ball) for the person to hold on to.



Choose bright swimwear for your child to help visibility: **neon orange or green are best**. Avoid black, blue and pastel-coloured swimwear. Swim t-shirts will help to keep your child visible and some have UPF protection to help guard against sunburn.

Buoyancy aids can help children to gain independence in the water but they never replace constant adult supervision.

Children should never be allowed to go on inflatables such as donuts or unicorns in open water due to strong currents.

Life jackets for the likes of paddle boarding and canceing are essential, even for strong swimmers. A whistle and mobile phone in a water proof pouch also help.
