Reception See Spotlight

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we introduced our new English topic Classic Stories with Supertato. We looked at the characters and discussed their feelings and the reasons why. In maths we have been counting in 2s, 5s and 1os. In topic we did observational drawings of plants.

Year 2 What a fantastic and busy first week back in Year 2! This week we have started reading an exciting book called 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons'. In PSHE we have also been understanding the importance of having rules as well as understanding that we have different rules in different settings.

Year 3 Year 3 have had a wonderful first week of the Summer Term. On Wednesday they demonstrated their continuing skills in tennis while on the courts at Ormskirk Tennis Club. Then on Thursday the children went to their first ever school swimming lessons and impressed both their class teachers and swimming teachers.

Year 4 The children have made a fantastic start to their final term in Year 4. They have continued to work hard on decimals in maths and will be applying this knowledge to money. In PE, we have begun Athletics and in Science we are learning about Sound. The children have completed their final 'With You Always' session and are continuing to prepare for their upcoming Sacraments.

Year 5 Year 5 had a wonderful time making a terrible mess in Art, otherwise known as tie-dying, but the t-shirts, which they shall wear in our residential trip in June, turned out brilliantly. In Maths we have been looking at types of angle, estimating the size of them and measuring them in degrees with a half-moon protractor. In Science we have started looking at forces acting on bikes and aeroplanes and we have found where Greece is on various maps as we prepare to study the Ancient Greeks.

Year 6 Year 6 have carried on where they left off before Easter. We've have begun our new topics across the curriculum, from Detective Fiction in English to Witnesses in RE. In Geography we have started to look at the Lake District in preparation for our residential trip to Tower Wood next month. The children have also had a busy Friday with both yoga and striking & fielding lessons delivered by West Lancs Sports Partnership.
