Spotlight on Reception


This week in Reception we have been continuing our work on the story 'Lost and Found' By Oliver Jeffers. We created our own 'Lost' posters to help find the Penguin. We used describing words and used our phonics skills to segment the sounds to write the words. We even tried to use capital letters and full stops too!

In Maths we have been learning about the composition of number 5. We played games to find different combinations of number that make 5. We discussed that these numbers are the parts and 5 is the whole.

Dear parents, carers and grandparents,

Thank you to all staff, children and parents for working together to ensure school functioned safely during this week's cold spell of weather.

The paragraph below is shared to communicate our wider school links and the experiences children receive during their lessons. Mrs Avington is the subject lead for Modern Foreign Languages, (MFL), and communicates the following:

In 2020, through an organisation called "etwinning," St Anne's decided to embark on a Penpal project between our year five pupils and a school in Nantes, in north-western France. This project lasted two years and through a series of video clips, the children were able to exchange information about life and traditions in their respective countries. This project was invaluable especially as schools across the world became so isolated during the Covid19 crisis. In Autumn 2022, we started a new link with a small catholic school in Nans- les- Pins in South East France. The children wrote letters in their native language to each other to share information about their interests and school life. This term the children will pair up with a child from our partner school in France and write a letter- this time in French! We hope in the summer term to set up some videos to share more about life in our respective schools!

Curriculum News

Nursery The children were very excited in Nursery this week to experience playing in snow! We have been talking about Winter so it was nice to have a hands on experience, the children used all their senses and lots of language to describe what they can see and feel. The children worked together to build a snowman and to make snowballs to play with! Some children were even brave enough to create snow angels! All the children have been working really hard in Literacy and Maths, we have seen their development in their play. Well done.

Reception <u>See Spotlight</u>

Year 1 This week in year 1 we have been continuing with our Traditional Tale, 'Snow White'. We have been writing letters asking and responding to questions as characters from the tale. In Maths we have been adding to 20 using a number line and have started to look at the number bonds to 20. In science we have continued to identify what materials different items around the classroom were made from and their properties.

Year 2 This week we have been using coins and notes to make different amounts of money to buy items and we've been learning to give change of various amounts. In science we've been discussing and sorting living and non-living things by applying the seven life processes.

Year 3 This week Year 3 have been following on from last weeks computing lesson where they learnt about inputs and outputs of a desk top computer by learning the same about a laptop and understanding what a hard drive, ROM and RAM are. They have then made a paper laptop with all the components they have learnt about placed in the correct places.

Year 4 We all had a great time in the snow this week; playing with our friends and building snowmen together on the playground. We have used our researching skills on the lpads to find out information about an Arctic animal. When we had all of the information, we then created a fact file about the animal to be displayed in the hall. In PE we have choreographed the next sections of our 1960's themed dances and continued to develop our skills for rounders.

Year 5 have been studying the intricacies of the planets and how they orbit the Sun, because of the latter's huge gravitational pull. Ordnance Survey maps and atlases have fascinated us and we are learning how symbols on a map help us find what we are looking for. In English we have been writing science fiction settings is Star Wars science fiction or history we want to know..."Long, long ago, in a galaxy far, far away..."? In Maths we are tackling the bus stop method of division - we'd rather catch a real bus!

Year 6 There's been such a variety of work covered in Year 6 this week. From learning about the continent of Antarctica in preparation for a study of Sir Ernest Shackleton to looking at silhouette art. The children have been studying closely the characters from the Wizard of Oz and comparing how they are presented in the book and the film, the similarities and differences. Last week in Dance the children focused on the theme of 'The School of Rock' and this week it has been the music from 'The Parent Trap.' What a great way to end the week!


