In PE we have continued to practice our kicking and striking and on Thursday we finished our circus dance. In Music we have learnt about the 'texture' of the music and discussed the different layers in pieces of music. We identified when a piece of music had lots of layers; a thick texture or not many layers ; a thin texture.

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### Curriculum News

**Nursery** The children have been very busy this week learning 'The story of Christmas', they have worked very hard learning all the key words and the actions to our story. The children have also been dressing up in Nativity costumes and pretending to be in the story. In RE the children have shared their experiences of having a new baby in their houses, and how they "celebrated the new baby". In Maths the children have been using lollipop sticks to create stables following different designs and identifying any shapes that they can see.

**Reception** This week in Reception we have been learning about Advent and the meaning of the Advent wreath. We learned that the candles represent Hope, Love, Joy, Peace and Christ. The children have had a wonderful time creating their own Advent wreaths. We have been busy preparing for our upcoming Nativity play and the children can't wait to perform it next week. In Literacy we have been reading Little Red Riding Hood and we used our phonic skills to create a shopping list for her. In Maths this week we have been leaning about rectangles and squares. The children went on a shape hunt to find these shapes in our class.
