### Year 1

This week in year 1 the children have worked super hard to write their very own ending for the story 'Up and Down' using finger spaces, full stops and capital letters. We are so proud! In maths we have started addition, the children have used the part-whole model to solve different calculations and also looked at fact families. They were so excited for their Hand Hygiene session which explored the importance of washing our hands and how we keep healthy.

The children have worked extremely hard this week. They have been doing some super Phonics work, applying their phonic knowledge to sentence writing. 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### <u>Newsletter</u>



St Anne's celebrated the European Day of Languages on the 24th of September. This event is held across Europe and aims to promote the rich linguistic diversity of Europe and raise awareness of the importance of lifelong language learning for everyone. Every year group found a different way to celebrate the event!

In Reception, the children learnt some signs using Makaton, a language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate. They learnt to sing the number song "3 little monkeys," making some animal signs using Makaton.



n Year One the children had been learning about the body in their science topic. So they learnt how to say the parts of the body and followed the song "Tête, épaules, genoux et pieds" – Head, shoulders, knees and toes in French!






The Year Two children, learnt how to say and write the names of members of their family in French. They also learnt how to make the sign of the cross in French!



In Year Five- not content with just learning French – the children learned to count to 10 in Spanish, played Bingo with those numbers, learned some basic greetings and finished with a hula dance whilst following the instructions in Spanish! ¡Fantástico!

The Year Six classes also used their persuasive language skills to explore the importance of learning a language. Finally they rose to the challenge of learning a German song!
