Building Levy Letter

Dear parents and carers,

Almost all schools within the Archdiocese of Liverpool are voluntary aided schools. Voluntary aided status provides distinct freedoms and flexibilities in the way that schools operate but, in return for the privilege of having and controlling such a school, there is a need to make a contribution to some costs, including those associated with capital investment.

Government provides the money annually for staff salaries, books and equipment for all schools. Catholic school buildings are constructed and repaired predominantly through Government grants but are owned by the Trustees of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Under current legislation voluntary aided schools have to find 10% of the costs of all capital works i.e. investment in the building fabric over a value of £2,000. In order to help meet these costs the Archdiocese operates a school building fund to help meet the 10% costs of major projects and all of the investment funded through the Archdiocese's annual capital programme.

Parishes and schools contribute equally to the building fund and the school share provides the opportunity for parents of children who benefit from the facilities to contribute on a voluntary basis. The school share is based upon an annual amount calculated at £10.00 per child (or family where there is more than one child attending the same school) and, whilst the decision regarding the raising of this levy is a local one, the majority of schools invite a voluntary contribution from parents on this basis.

Payments can be made up to Thursday 17th October 2024. Cash can be sent into school in an envelope entitled 'Levy' on the front. You can also pay online through scopay, if you have more than one child in school just put the contribution into one of your children's accounts. If paying by scopay pay just complete the amount you wish to pay and go to the basket to send.

Parents are reminded that there is no legal obligation to make any contribution and pupils at any of our schools will not be treated differently according to whether or not their parents have done so.

The levy continues to play a crucial role to maximise the continued investment in our school buildings and, in recent years, has helped to facilitate significant investment in Catholic schools across the Archdiocese through various funding streams and initiatives.

Curriculum News

Nursery The children have been very busy creating self-portraits this week! The children have been finding out what makes them Unique and different from their friends. We have been talking about our families and what we enjoy doing together. We have been exploring our environment looking at different shapes and have been extending repeating patterns.

Reception This week we have been reading Rosie's Walk, we learned actions and then ordered picture to sequence the story. In maths we have been sorting items, we even went to Willow Woods to sort natural items. It has been very exciting seeing the builders create our new outdoor area!

Year 1 This week, we have been learning to read and write numbers up to 10, and we encourage you to support this at home by practising how to spell these numbers as words. In English, we commenced our exciting author study of Oliver Jeffers, exploring his delightful book "Lost and Found." In History, we have started to look at the life of King Charles, applying our chronology skills to create a timeline that highlights the significant events in his life. Lastly, in Science, we had a hands-on experience labelling body parts, which really brought our learning to life.

Year 2 This week in year 2, we have been counting in 10's to 100 using lots of different ways. In English we have carried on exploring and have started gathering information for our leaflets. We have also looked at different materials and how they have different uses and why they are chosen.

Year 3 Year 3 have been tasting different ingredients that might be placed in a salad, ready to design their own Rainbow Salads this coming week. They have also been learning about significant historical events that have happened in Ormskirk and ordering them on a timeline.

Year 4 We have had another fantastic week in Year 4. We are enjoying reading our text 'The Astounding Broccoli Boy' and thinking about how the author uses language. In Maths, we are continuing with Place Value and have continued to learn more about Teeth in Science. We had a brilliant first swimming lesson.

Year 5 are loving studying legends and discovering how they are different to myths. In Maths we have been rounding large numbers to 10, 100 and 1000 and in Science we have looked at how children become adults, whilst comparing that to how animals make that transition. In tennis we have seen some great skills, so Wimbledon here we come.


