In Reception this week the children have been focussing on the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. The children have enjoyed exploring all the different enhancement and challenges around the classroom linked to our story.

We have been creating actions to help us re tell the story and we have even created our own story maps for the different sections of the story. We worked hard to identify the phonemes that we could hear in the words we were writing. We used our story maps to help us to remember the sequence of the story when we were re telling it

The children also enjoyed playing outside in the snow, having snowball fights against their teachers.

The children have continued with their tennis lessons with West Lancs, really developing their co-ordination and agility skills. There were lots of brilliant listeners and the children followed the difficult instructions given. They were Pros!

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#### Curriculum News

**Nursery** the children have been learning about the Arctic, talking about what it looks like and the different animals that live there! The children have been using their wider vocabulary to describe the different animals using information they have learnt this week and their knowledge.

The children were very excited to see some snow this week, we had a wonderful time playing on the field in it, it was great to link to our topic of the Arctic.

#### Reception See this weeks Spotlight

Year 1 This week in Year 1 the children have wrote their own traditional tale about the story 'Rumpelstiltskin'. They have used story openers, adjectives to describe characters and have tried so hard to remember capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. We have our very own authors on our hands! We have continued to look at L.S Lowry's work and we have started painting our Lowry City Collage.

Year 2 . This week the children have completed their unit of work on money and have begun to learn about multiplication by grouping and repeated addition. They have been super learners! During the English sessions they have chunked, boxed, planned and begun writing their own innovated version of 'The Pirate Cruncher.' Their ideas have been amazing!! PE sessions have been great fun and a great chance to exercise away from the icy weather. They have played some great games - musical statues, across the golden river, and circuits - to practice their jumping and balancing skills. In Science the children have continued to learn about living things, this week making posters to explain what animals need to survive. The children are making great progress within Phase 6 of their Phonics programme. They have perfected the rules of adding the suffixes- ng and -ed. Well done Y2!!

Year 3 "We have been looking at what life was like in Roman Britain, especially being amazed at the hypocausts (underfloor heating. In RE we are looking at the life of prayer in the life of Christ and in English we have been writing non-chronological reports about Romans - we can now write an introduction and conclusions. In PE we have been learning to sprint in relays - we learnt that the handover is just as important as the sprinting part itself."

**Year 4** have had a really fun week this week. In Science we have carried out investigations using simple circuits. We looked at how to make the bulb brighter, how to make the buzzer sound and make the motor move. In PE we completed some more fitness tests and then practiced relay running in athletics.

**Year 5** have been exploring our Solar System, naming and ordering the planets. They have then found fascinating facts related to the different planets. They've been developing their story planners to put together amazing science fiction story outlines, which will capture the readers imagination.

Year 6 .We have been continuing to work hard this week on classic fiction in English as well as creating different types of silhouettes in Art. We also did some excellent research on the great explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton and his expeditions to Antarctica.

#### SHOP AND GIVE

Ormskirk Food Bank donations can be handed in at several shops and other businesses, in addition to their base at New Church House Ormskirk. They list:

Tesco Store, Burscough Bridge (Please note: this is for food bought in this store. Food purchased in other stores must be sealed and clearly labelled as having been purchased elsewhere). Also:

Booths, Ringtail Park, Burscough; Co-op, 52 Wigan Rd, Ormskirk; Co-op, 58 Town Green Ln, Aughton; Morrison's, 2 Park Rd, Ormskirk; Nationwide, Burscough Street, Ormskirk; Halifax, Church Street, Ormskirk; Kicking Donkey Pub, Narrow Moss Lane.

Other supermarkets are making their own contributions to the cost-of-living crisis. For example, Lidl labels items on shelves which can be placed in their collection point at the checkouts. These donations will be used "to help local community groups in need of supplies, including food banks, soup kitchens, community centres and more."

Parishioners wishing to donate food in any of the above ways should perhaps check arrangements first with individual stores.
