St Anne's Catholic Primary School Spotlight on Year 5

If you can dream it, you can do it!

Building our future!

We are only four weeks from the end of term and Year 5 are in the thick of learning. Our topics have enthralled us, entertained us and inspired us!

In English we have been studying biographies and next we will move onto poetry – we are finding out what haiku, cinquains and tankas are. We have been writing biographies using formal language and different sentence structures – we have looked at a range of saints and even our house named people.

In Maths we have recently finished creating equivalent fractions and we have learnt how to add and subtract them. Next we move on to telling the time in analogue and digital times and we will even look at how to read bus/train timetables.

In History we have studied the Golden Age Of Islam centred around Baghdad (aka The Round City). We were fascinated by the advances made in Science, Maths and Medicine in the House Of Wisdom, which was the seat of learning in the ancient world at the time. Sadly, it came to an end in horrific circumstances, when the Mongol hordes slaughtered over 1 million people and threw the books into the River Tigris – it is said there were so many books in the river that

it turned black and Mongol horsearchers could ride across them as if they were a bridge.

In PE we have been developing our balances – we have learnt the difference between a matched and a mirror balance, a counter balance and a counter tension and a weight-bearing balance and a part weight-bearing balance.

In Science we have been learning all about materials and their changing states. We have learnt how some solids dissolve into a liquid to create a solution and some solids do not dissolve in a liquid, so a mixture is made. Recently, we watched irreversible changes occur when we mixed vinegar and bicarbonate of soda together (and we tried coke and sugar). A chemical change occurred and carbon dioxide was given off. Interesting stuff!

In ICT we have studied search engines for finding information quickly on the internet – we have learnt to narrow down a search and improve our use of key words.

In Music we have been learning to perform music on a glockenspiel, especially jazz and blues.

Best of all, we love learning French,

speaking it and singing songs – we can buy things in French at a café and we are also learning how to say what we like and don't like.

In RE we have been looking at making commitments, so we have looked at marriage and what to look for in a marriage partner. More recently, we have begun working hard on our Carol Service, which is due to take place in December (St Anne's Church). Please come along to celebrate this festive time of the year — it will be a great way of celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ.

We have decided that our theme will be linked to Prophecy and Promise, the children will make an Advent promise which will be used to decorate our tree. Nursery The children have been exploring Space this week, we have been talking about all the different planets and have created our own Galaxy on the windows. We have looked at how you can travel to Space and the children have been busy making junk model rockets, and have had some great ideas about what they would take to Space with them! Reception In Reception this week we have been designing our own superheroes and thinking about what special powers they might have. In maths we have been learning about numbers 4 and 5 and learning to subitise! In computing we have been learning about following instructions. We had to use our listening ears very carefully.

Year 1 This week we started our new English genre, letters. We have identified the features of a letter and the content in preparation of writing our own. In maths we have looked at 2D and 3D shapes. In RE we heard about the Birth of Jesus and visit of the Shepherd's.

Year 2 In year two the children have been learning about The Three Little Wolves And The Big Bad Pig. The children have been collecting verbs and phrases from the story to use in their sentences. In maths the children have been looking at solving number problems, addition and subtraction. Both classes have been working extremely hard.

Year 3 The Year 3 children have been thinking about how we are going to prepare for Advent and have made pledges to do over Advent. The children have also been creating their own version of a fable, after exploring a range of fables over the last few weeks

Year 4 Year 4 have been working hard this week on multiplication strategies. In English the children have written some fantastic versions of the 'The Sorting Ceremony' from Harry Potter, using fronted adverbials, speech and complex sentences. In Science, we have been writing about the journey of food through the digestive system.

Dear St Anne's

The public consultation on the future of Nye Bevan Pool and Park Pool is now open and we invite you to share your opinions and thoughts about the facilities on the Council's online consultation portal <u>Your Voice West Lancashire.</u>

The Council are reviewing the future of both centers which are heavily subsidized to keep them operational. Options open to the Council include closing the existing facilities and revisiting existing plans for the two new Hubs to incorporate above ground swimming pools that are more sustainable and economically viable.

There has been no final decision made on the closure of the leisure centers. After the consultation there will be a full review, and then further proposals will be taken to Council for a final decision to be made.
