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## In school this week.....

### Nursery

We have continued exploring Polar Animals and their habitats. The children enjoyed small world play navigating polar animals through various "icy" sensory materials. We focused on expanding our descriptive language to explain how the materials felt. To sharpen our listening and maths skills, we set up "a Polar animal feeding challenge". Instead of simply picking a fish, the children had to listen carefully to specific mathematical properties - such as the number of sides or corners - before "fishing" for the correct shape to feed the hungry animals. In Maths we have been focusing on subitising. This is the ability to look at a small group and instantly know the total without counting them one by one. The children have been showing great speed and accuracy during our subitising games. During literacy we used body percussion - including claps, stomps and pats - to create sound effects and mimic the rhythm of our stories. This has made story time exciting and has helped the children develop a better sense of beat and syllabic structure.



### Reception

This week in Reception we have been reading 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We ordered the story then added a label or caption for each picture. In maths we have been learning about mass and capacity. We investigated the mass of different objects and then we compared the capacity of different containers and ordered them. In RE we have been learning about Jesus welcoming the little children - we thought about how to make someone feel welcome in our classroom and we made a beautiful welcome sign.





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## Year 1


This week, we have been very busy continuing to practise our performance ready to show you all. In English, we wrote our own alternative version of Snow White, using our imagination to change characters. In Maths, we practised subtraction calculations using a number line to help us count back confidently. In History, we learned about the Great Fire of London by creating a timeline showing how the fire started and what happened as it spread. In Science, we investigated different materials and predicted which ones would absorb water.

The children enjoyed making pictures move in their computing lessons. In R.E. they decorated their own candles to gather and celebrate Candlemas.



## Year 2

In English, we continued reading Pirate Cruncher and began planning our own creative twists to the story, ready to write our own versions next week. In Maths, we finished our money unit, tackling the tricky skill of finding change and solving two-step money problems. In RE, we learned about how Jesus was tempted and discussed how we can also be tempted in everyday life. We explored what sin means, how we can try to avoid it, and how God forgives us. We also looked at Jesus' miracles, focusing on the story of the paralysed man. In PE, the children continued practising their Alice in Wonderland dance and developed skills such as hopping and sidestepping. Our Geography lesson focused on Australia, where we learned about its human and physical features and used our knowledge to write a fact file. In History, we explored different sources to learn about the pioneering female pilot Amy Johnson and why she is an important historical figure.





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## Year 3

In Year 3 this week the children have been incredibly busy. In English, they have written the most wonderful diary extracts. They have all been truly fascinated by the events in Pompeii. In History the children have been learning about the lasting impact on Britain from Roman invasion and how significant the changes such as central heating and sanitary systems are still in place today. In R.E the children have been focusing the miracles performed by Jesus and on the parable of 'The Seed'. The children created very dramatic freeze frames to depict different parts of the miracle and they also created wonderful pictures stain glass windows to retell a part of the story. The children also had an exciting session building Lego.



## Year 4

It was lovely to start our week with Prayer and Liturgy learning a new hymn with actions with Miss Dewhurst and Mr Knowles. We have worked hard in maths looking at length and perimeter, using measurements of metres and kilometres and converting these measurements. In English, we have been using our key information and plans to write a non-chronological report about Matthew Henson and his amazing expedition to the North Pole. For our science topic, Living things and their Habitats we have been learning about how animals are classified into vertebrates and invertebrates by looking at certain characteristics. There were some incredible designs using CAD in Computing- we look forward to developing our games next week. To end the week, we joined in with the Live Wicked Singalong for Young Voices and had a brilliant time at our STEM Lego session with Cosmos Corner- check out Instagram for the pictures!






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## Year 5

It was Class 11's turn to improve their bike-handling skills outside in the cold and rain. They all did fabulously well and stayed safe. In English, we have been learning to write science fiction stories with lots of action and excitement. In Maths we were learning to divide in different ways and in Science, we were learning all about the Moon and especially the phases of the Moon. We think that one day we will have 13 months to tie in with the lunar month of 28 days (the Romans did give us two new months (July and August) 2 millennia ago!



## Year 6

The Year 6 children have continued to thrive in their PE lessons over the last week. Through their Friday sessions with West Lancs., they have been developing their basketball skills and working together in small teams. Then in yoga, they thought carefully about their night time routines alongside learning some new stretches, including one called 'toe torture!' Back in class, the children have been focusing on which objects light can travel through and how shadows are formed when an object is opaque. They have focused carefully on the characters of the Wizard of Oz and wrote a persuasive speech from the perspective of the Lion.





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



