Nursery In Nursery this week we have been talking about our families. The children have drawn beautiful pictures of who lives in their house which are displayed in Nursery and have been counting how many people there are. We have been talking about 'feelings', the children have been looking at images and have described how the people are feeling and why.

Reception This week in Reception we have started learning our letter sounds and beginning to work with the numbers 1-3. We have also started our religion topic 'Myself' and learnt about how important our names are. The children have been sequencing the story of Rosie's walk and learning about the importance of healthy teeth.

Year 1 Another fantastic week in Year 1! The children have started their new English topic 'Stories by the same author'. We have read our new English book 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. The children have been brilliant making predictions about the story and identifying the characters feelings. This week we have enjoyed creating our own self-portrait on Purple Mash. Remember to always check our Twitter pages to see what we get up to!

Year 2 Even though it has only been a four-day week, the Year 2 children have been busy bees! They have been learning to write descriptions in English using fantastic adjectives. You should read how they have described George's medicine - yuk!! The children have been continuing to learn about place value and have been creating number lines using intervals of 10 and 1. In Science they have been learning about the effects of exercise on their bodies - both physical benefits, as well as benefits for a healthy mind.

Year 3 We are now deep into learning mode in Year 3, as we continue to research and write our own biographies/ autobiographies and use our knowledge of place value to solve problems. In our RE we have been creating a recipe for a happy home and in tennis we were learning to hit a double-handed backhand (known as the Pocket Rocket, because the shot begins by your pocket).
