# Spotlight on Year 4

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#### Curriculum News

**Nursery** We have continued to enjoy exploring Space this week. We went on an imaginary adventure to explore the different planets, we recreated the planet Saturn in groups shot through the galaxy as comets, walked on the moon and floated through space! The children have been creating their own rockets in junk modelling and have made aliens using 2D shapes and play dough. The children have been continuing to work hard in Math's and Phonics. **Reception** This week in Reception we have been learning about superheroes and thinking about what superpowers we could have. We used our super phonics to write a super sentence! In maths we have been learning about how we can find 1 less than a number up to 5. We sang the song 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' and we noticed that there was 1 less frog as they jumped into the pool. In art this week we created our own superhero masks by exploring colour mixing of primary colours, we created secondary colours and then used objects to print on our masks. In RE this week, we have been learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali, we listened to the story of Rama and Sita and created some Diwali lanterns, rangoli patterns and mehndi patterns.

**Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have started to look at letters. We have written about why we send or receive letters and have looked at formal and informal letters and what features each of these has. In maths we have been identifying and sorting 3D shapes. We have also begun our RE topic on 'Waiting' and have learnt different facts about England in our Geography.

**Year 2** This week the children have been working so hard on planning and writing their innovated version of 'The Three Little Wolves' and they make such an exciting read!! In Maths the children have been doing subtraction challenges using the exchanging method. They have worked so hard and showed great resilience! In the afternoons, the children have been so engaged in their learning about the Jewish tradition of Shabbat. They have written fantastic acrostic poems and made beautiful spice boxes. We have been so proud of their enthusiasm, curiosity and respect. Today we are welcoming the fire service into school, as part of the PSHE curriculum, to talk to the children about 'keeping safe'.

**Year 3** The Year 3 children are continuing to enjoy learning to speak and write in French, including greetings, colours and shapes. They have completed the topic of fables and have written their own fantastic versions of 'The Hare and the Tortoise.' After learning about emails, they have been emailing their teachers to tell them fascinating facts about themselves and sending attachments.

#### Year 4 <u>See Spotlight</u>

**Year 6** Year 6 have really enjoyed their work on Judaism this week focusing on the celebration of Rosh Hashana and the hard work on Mitzvah Day. They even managed to try out apple and honey, a favourite Jewish delicacy. They have also focused on tsunamis and writing in the style or survival writers, inspired by their text 'Running Wild'.
