



St Anne's Catholic Primary School achieves the Live Simply Award

Pupils and staff from St Anne's Catholic Primary School in Ormskirk have achieved the Live Simply Award validating they are living simply, sustainably, and in solidarity with the world's poorest communities.



The award, championed by overseas development charity CAFOD, was presented to the Catholic school after they successfully planned and implemented faith inspired actions that highlighted the importance of caring for people and the planet.

Their actions have had a positive impact throughout the school, in their local community, and globally too, as they reached out to make a difference.

The children in the school council and the Eco Club worked together with the teachers, the pupils, and the local community to lead our Live Simply Actions. The children met regularly to discuss and plan out any actions and share the journey with the school community through assemblies and meetings. One highlight, identified by one of the children, involved working closely with the pastors to create our Liturgical prayer garden, another highlight included linking up with the local high school to celebrate the junior fundraising event for Nugent Care, by attending the Metropolitan Cathedral Good Shepherd Mass.

Miss Whiteside, RE subject leader at St Anne's Catholic Primary School, who led the Live Simply journey, said: "It is so wonderful to see the children work together, plan, lead and organise all of our actions over the last two years. They have been able to identify issues that they wanted to help solve or support, as well as seeing the impact their work is having on each other and the wider world. I am super proud of everything we continue to do as we grow and continue our work as a Live Simply School".

A Year 5 student commented on why they took part in the Live Simply Award; "I think it is really important to be part of the Live Simply Award because God made everyone to love one another and make we help people who are not as fortunate as us. We helped by raising money and selecting important Cafod World Gifts such as clothing, sewing kits and water and food packages."

Nursery This week in Nursey the children have been continuing to look at mini beasts, we have been looking at ladybirds more closely. We have also been doing lots of phonic and maths work. All the children have been working really hard this term and we look forward to next term for lots more fun.

Reception In Reception this week we have been creating our final Gaudi inspired artwork, we used mosaic to create space themed artwork. In RE on Monday we planned our Pentecost celebration and this afternoon we enjoyed celebrating Pentecost together. We learned how to travel along benches and jumping volts as different animals in Gymnastics this week.

Year 1 This week we have been looking at acrostic poems and planned our own poem about a monster. In maths we have been looking at position to the right, left, above and below. We finished our flowers sculptures inspired by Van Gogh and finished our work on the Titanic.

Year 2 This week in Year 2 the children have been using our new outdoor classroom for our Science lessons, where the children identified all the different plans that we have on our school grounds. In Science we also concludes our comparative tests to determine what a plant needs to grow and survive. In English, the children have been learning about riddles and they created their own fantastic riddles about fruit.

Year 3 This week the children in Year 3 have been sewing their amazing explorer bags, which included using a running stitch, sewing on a button and attaching a handle. They have also been learning how to tell the time on an analogue clock to time minute intervals.
