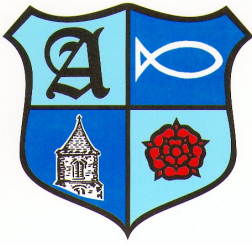

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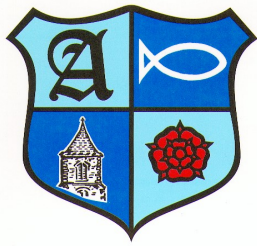

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Curriculum News

Nursery We have had a lovely first week back in Nursery listening to all the adventures you had over the Easter Holidays. The children have been discussing Spring this week, talking about the changes that are happening around them. We all went for a Spring colour walk around School, collecting lots of different natural objects of different colours and shades. The children have created beautiful observational paintings of flowers and used different materials to make collage rainbows.

Reception In Reception we have started our new topic- Space! We have read the story 'Look Up!' and created our own poster to encouraged people to look up into the night sky. In maths we have been learning to count beyond 10 and in PE we have been playing tennis on the tennis courts. Class 2 enjoyed exploring Willow Wood in Forest School.

Year 1 This week, we have been counting in multiples of 2, 5, and 10, and enjoyed the story *Supertato*. We also celebrated Earth Day by learning about how to care for our planet.

Year 2 This short week has been a busy one in Year 2, we have started Our new book 'The Boy who grew dragons'. This is one of Miss Banks' and Miss Williams' favourite units as the book is such an exciting book with lots of opportunities to use our imaginations. Also we have started rehearsing for our Play this week! In Maths this week we have started our fractions unit looking at halves. In PE this week, we focused on balancing and skills to throw and catch.

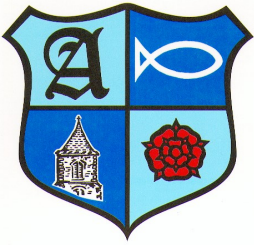
Year 3 The children in Year 3 have loved beginning to learn about the Stone Age through to the Iron Age through their English, History and Dance lessons. They have also really enjoyed beginning their 'Striking and Fielding ' PE lessons, developing their throwing and catching skills.

Year 4 We have had a wonderful first week back. The children have worked hard in all areas of the curriculum, starting with great 'Book Talk' when we introduced our new text for English this half term. We are using our knowledge of decimals to convert amounts of money and begun to think about Online Safety in our ICT lessons. We enjoyed being back at swimming!

Year 5 Inspired by Rory McIlroy's brilliant Masters win, Year 5 have decided to emulated him in PE. We have been learning to hit drives and putty accurately - we have some amazing drivers! In History we are looking at Ancient Greece and we have learnt how it was not one country (unless they were fighting against the Persian invaders), but it was organised into many city-states, such as Athens, Sparta, Argos or Corinth. In Science we are identifying forces, such as gravity (which is 9.8 newtons on Earth) and types of friction. Great stuff!

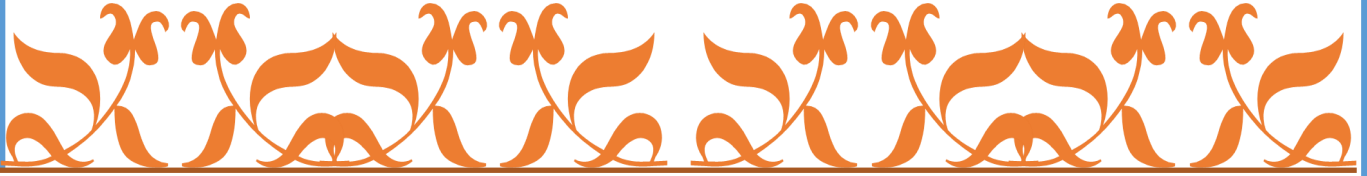

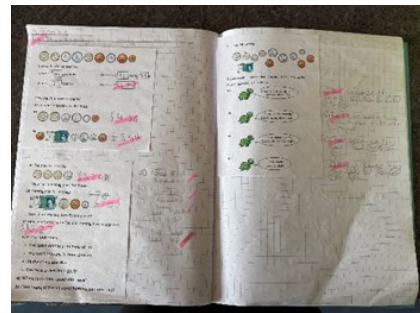

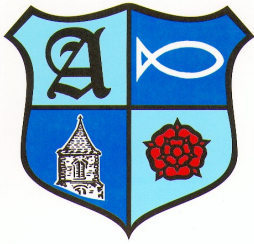

Dear parents/carers

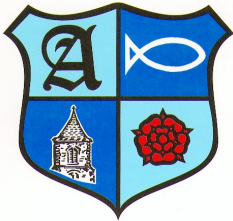

1 Enjoy reading the Gospel

The disciples were gathered in a room. They had locked the doors because they were afraid of the people who had crucified Jesus. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" and he showed them the wounds in his hands and his side. Thomas, one of the disciples, was not there when Jesus came and he refused to believe what had happened. One week later, they were in the room again, and Thomas was also there. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Here, touch the marks on my hands and feel the wound in my side. Doubt no longer, but believe." Thomas replied, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "You believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who have not seen me and yet believe!"

Which words stood out for you in this Gospel, and why? What does the picture make you think about? Enjoy exploring this Wednesday's word, which is **BELIEVE**

2 "We all have in our hearts some areas of unbelief. Let us say to the Lord: I believe!" Pope Francis


What did Jesus say about those who believed without seeing? After seeing the risen Jesus, Thomas believed that he was alive - he still is! Believing in the resurrection adds something very special to our lives and this cannot be found anywhere else. Jesus invited Thomas to believe and he makes the same invitation to you and me. Ask your child what the word 'believe' means to them, and what it means to 'believe' in Jesus. Each of you say one way that believing in Jesus improves life?

3 Jesus' resurrection - his victory over death - is the greatest event in history! Even though, like Thomas, you may sometimes have doubts, be assured that, when you do doubt, Jesus is still truly close to you and ready to help you to believe. As we journey through Easter, which of the following ways could best help you, as a family, to grow in your belief in Jesus? Perhaps it could be: reading about what Jesus did and said; being with others who believe; asking God to help you grow in belief; living out Jesus' teachings and seeing the difference it makes to your lives.

Dear Lord Jesus, please help our **belief** in you to grow, through recognising your presence in the loving words and actions of those around us. Amen.

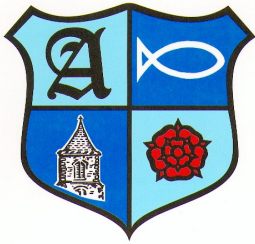

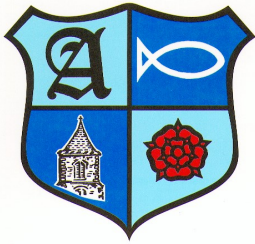
