Curriculum News

Nursery We have had lots of fun this week looking after our Ducklings! Also this week we have been learning about life on a farm, discovering all the different animals and the names of their babies. Also this week the children have really enjoyed bringing in their favourite books from home to share with their friends, we have talked about why they are their favourites and the children have enjoyed talking about why they have enjoyed the story.

Reception This week we have had some new arrivals in our class- the chicks have arrived! We have watched them hatch from their eggs and have taken good care of them. We can't wait to see if anymore will hatch. We have also been learning all about dinosaurs. We have learnt about the different types of dinosaurs and talked about what they look like, how they lived and discussed if they were a herbivore, carnivore or omnivore. We have also been making the most of the beautiful weather by doing some arts and crafts outside as well as lots of other learning!

Year 1 Another busy week in Year 1! We are really enjoying our new English topic on 'Recounts' the children have worked hard to recognise that a recount needs time words and that it needs to be in the correct order. The children have had a challenging maths topic this week. We have looked at values of money and adding amounts. They are brilliant!

Year 2 This week we have been reading explanation texts which tell us how and why things move or grow. We have been finding out about the stages of the lifecycle of the owl and learning some fantastic new words such as owlet and fledgling. In Maths we have been polishing up our skills of adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers. We can even now exchange up and down!! We are very proud of ourselves! In our wider curriculum we have been exploring, designing and making minibeasts with moving parts. It was a challenge, but great fun! We have also been finishing our units of work in PE on athletics and invasion games. Our teachers were very impressed with our running, jumping and throwing skills. In Science we have been celebrating the work that we did in British Science Week. We have created some amazing posters about fantastic minibeasts and where we can find them. We hope Mrs Brookfield loves them! We also have a little surprise for our wonderful mums this weekend!!

Year 3 A busy week with lots of focus on the Easter Play. We're so looking forward to having our mums, dads, nans and grandads in school with us next week!
