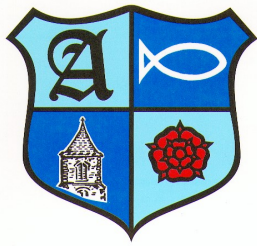

## Curriculum News



**Nursery** The Nursery children were very excited for Sports Day on Monday, thankfully the weather was good! All the children were amazing; laughing, smiling and having fun and cheering on their friends in all the races. It was lovely to see and hear the encouragement for all the children from all the parents it made every child feel very special during a busy but a little bit daunting experience. All the children enjoyed cheering the grown ups on in their races too.

**Reception** In Reception this week we have been drawing our own maps of what we see on the way to school. We have been continuing our learning on the Three Little Pigs and used our phonics to write descriptive sentences. We also enjoyed our Sports Day on Monday, we were all amazing!

**Year 1** This week, we explored *place value with numbers 50–100* in maths. In DT, we designed exciting *moving storybooks* and can't wait to start making them. During PSHE, we talked about *careers* and shared what we'd like to be when we grow up.

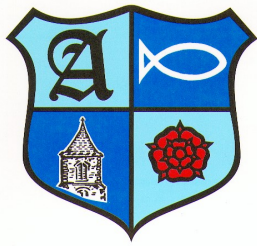
**Year 2** This week in Year 2, We have created our own version of the 'Pirate Cruncher'! In Maths, we have continued with our statistics unit looking at displaying information in various ways including tally, bar graphs and pictograms. In RE, we have started looking at other faiths and their beliefs.

**Year 3** This week, Year 3 have really enjoyed Sports Day, plus they have experienced running their own stalls for the first time for our charity morning, impressing us with their ideas and selling techniques. In Science, we are carrying out observations on the germination of a seed, keenly watching its progression.

**Year 4** Wow! What a busy week we have had! We worked hard in our teams for 'Charity Morning', raising a lot of money whilst having fun at the same time. Sports Day was very successful, the children showed determination and excellent teamwork. We have also had a wonderful celebration for all of the children who made their First Holy Communion, they read in mass beautifully and we had lots of fun in our party in the afternoon.

**Year 5** We have just about recovered from our trip last week and are back to serious learning again. We have been studying the legacy of Ancient Greece - did you know we get the word alphabet from the first two letters of the Greek alphabet? We also found that their last letter was Omega (a make of watch now) and another letter is Kappa (a make of athletic clothing). We discovered that we get so many words from Greek, such as triangle and metamorphosis. We loved it.

**Year 6** We've had a really enjoyable week in Year 6! We've powered on with our Matilda rehearsals as well working together to create successful stalls for Nugent Care Day. They varied from water pistol games, beat the goalie to bracelet making and brunch stalls! This was swiftly followed by our final Sports Day in the afternoon. Lots of running, great teamwork and encouraging support - a day to remember for sure!

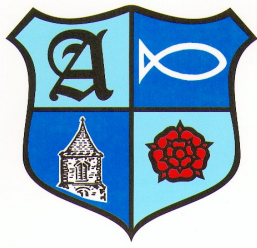

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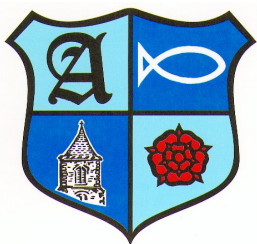


## CONGRATULATIONS
