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Curriculum News

Nursery See Spotlight

Reception This week in Reception we have been exploring our new outdoor area! We have had a great time learning outdoors! In maths this week we have been learning to compare amounts, using the vocabulary more, fewer and the same.

Year 1 This week we have been learning about verbs and the suffix 'ed'. We have also been identifying one more and one less than within 10. Class 3 also enjoyed their first Forest School session!

Year 2 This week year 2 have started to write their own information leaflet in English, linking to our topic of Dear Earth. The children have been enjoying learning about this topic and how to use conjunctions and adjectives in their sentences. In Maths children have been continuing their learning with place value which will soon be moving onto addition and subtraction. The children are loving learning about different artists and mark making in their art lessons.

Year 3 This week the Year 3 children have been tasting different possible ingredients to put into their Rainbow Salads. They have also completed the English topic of Biographies by writing a biography on Queen Elizabeth II. The children have also been learning greetings in French as part of European Language Day.

Year 4 Our tennis sessions were fantastic this week- we focused on forehand and throwing skills. In English we are starting to write our own chapter, based on our text 'The Astounding Broccoli Boy', using noun phrases to describe the setting. In Science, we have learned about the different type of teeth and their jobs.

Year 5 are immersed in the geography of the UK - we have been using maps, atlases and Google Earth to study locations and we have found out that our area (North West England) is one of the most densely populated areas in the UK (only beaten by London). In Science we have been investigating what affects gestation periods (length of pregnancy). In Maths we are adding and subtracting in different ways.

Year 6 During this week Year 6 have been looking at John Dyer's bright and vibrant jungle art, identifying parts they like and planning how they can use it in their own future pieces. This week has seen the culmination of our first English topic. The children have produced thoughtful and detailed hybrid texts about their chosen Paralympians. Thank you to those parents who came to the welcome meetings this week - it was lovely to begin the year with your support.
