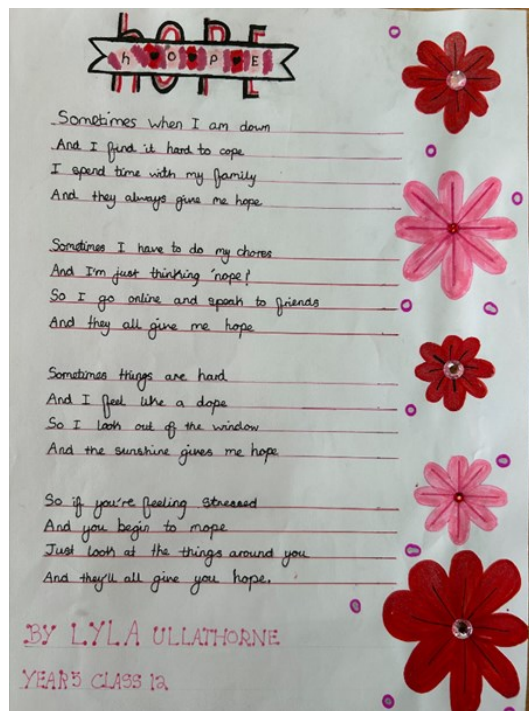

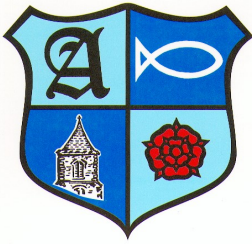

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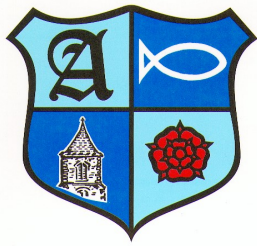

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Curriculum News

Nursery We have had an exciting week in Nursery watching the ducklings hatch from their eggs. The children were amazed to see how the ducklings managed to break the eggs and how big they were compared to the egg! We have been learning lots of new vocabulary and can't wait to continue watching them grow.

Reception We have had a very exciting delivery in Reception this week, 10 chicken eggs! So far 5 have hatched- we have enjoyed watching the chicks hatch and talking to our friends and family about this. We have been creating a 'Wanted' poster for the Giant from Jack and the Beanstalk and we have also been planting in our outdoor area with Mrs Jones.

Year 1 This week, we have been learning about volume and capacity in Maths. We have had great fun classifying animals by their food groups in Science.

Year 2 This week the children have been working super hard learning all about poetry. The children have been planning their very own stanza using rhyming words. This week the children will be looking at making their very own moving mini-beast and discussing what objects they could use for each part of their moving mini-beast. In R.E the children are learning all about the Easter story and how we can recognise that Lent is a time for reconciliation and forgiveness. We are incredibly proud of how hard the children have been working this week across all subjects.

Year 3 The children in Year 3 have been very busy this week. They have been creating their clay models using their sketches and the methods they have learnt to construct and create in the media of clay. They have also been practicing their Easter Reflection, demonstrating their wonderful singing and acting skills.

Year 4 We have put the finishing touches to our 'Egyptian Cinderella' stories and have been talking about Pharaohs and pyramids in our history lessons. We have continued to work hard on fractions and decimals. We thoroughly enjoyed World Poetry Day, performing a poem by Joseph Coelho called 'If All The World Were Paper'.

Year 5 Year 5 are loving the Sun, especially when we play tennis or do Bikeability. However we are struggling to find a Wimbledon winner (but you never know!). We have learnt about plants pollinate and how some plants reproduce by spreading runners along the ground (like strawberries and ivy). In English we have been debating the pros and cons of deforestation in the Amazon Basin and in Maths we have looked at timetables and perimeter.

Year 6 Year 6 have been finding some calm, reflective time (in between assessments!) whilst enjoying the sun on our daily Big Lent Walk.

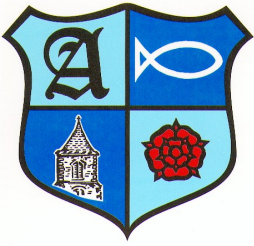

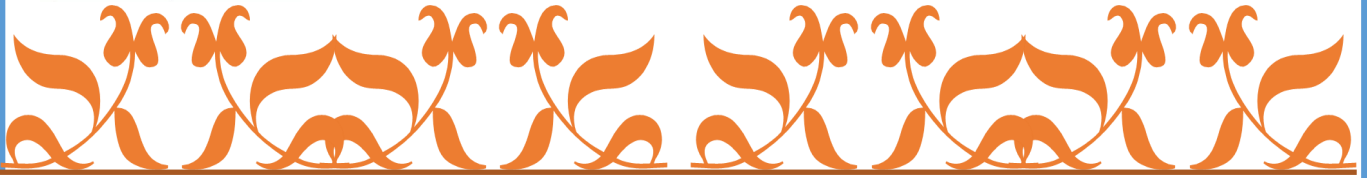

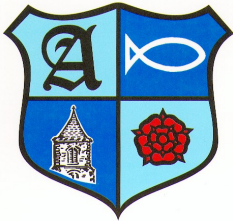

Dear Parents and Carers,

Jesus said, "A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, 'Father, let me have the inheritance that would come to me.' So the father gave him his share and his son then left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of shameless living. When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and he began to be in need and he had to hire himself out to feed pigs. So he decided to go back to his father. When his father saw him, he ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him. Then his son said, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him and kill the fattened calf, for this son of mine was lost and is now found.' And they began to celebrate."
