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Curriculum News

Nursery Who's been trip trapping past our Nursery? We have been looking closely at the characters of the story the '3 Billy goats Gruff'. We have re-enacted the story, taking on the roles with our friends. We went to visit Percy in Willow Woods and toasted marshmallows which were delicious! Enjoy your half term from all at the Nursery.

Reception This week we have been learning all about being good friends. We have written the ingredients for a friend recipe and included words like caring, sharing...We have painted our friends and make gifts with dough and other media for friends. We have also done lots of team building activities where we have had to work together and communicate ideas.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have looked at Traditional Rhymes in English. We investigated features of the rhyme 'Mary, Mary Quite Contrary' looking at the rhyming words and the repeated phrases. The children wrote their own fantastic versions of the traditional rhyme. In Maths this week we have continued to look at Place value and ordered numbers to 50 using the language smallest to greatest. In ICT the children have been learning about coding which was tricky but also a fun challenge to complete on Purple Mash. We have had such an exciting and busy half term and all of the children have worked incredibly hard.

Year 2 We have had a wonderful final week of the half term with lots of fantastic learning happening in Year 2! The children have written their own version of the classic poem 'What is Pink?' in response to their work on the seasons. They are truly fabulous!! In Maths the children have been finding quarters, halves and thirds of amounts and measures. It was tricky at first, but now they are fraction fantastic!! But most of all the children have enjoyed their study of Islam, finding out about how Muslim people worship. They have amazed us with their extensive knowledge!

Year 4 This week has been extremely special for Year 4 as they made their Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children have been working hard to prepare for this and their Holy Communion.
