Reception See Spotlight

Year 1 This week, we have enjoyed writing our letters to King Charles! We have been learning place value to 20. In RE, we have learned the significance of the angles and why they are important in the Christmas story. We have had lots of fun learning how to decode in Computing too.

Year 2 This week in English, we have started to plan our own twisted tale based on 'The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig.' In Maths, we have started our new 'Shape' unit, looking at 2-D and 3-D shapes, the children have all remembered so much from Year 1. In Science, we have been looking at how to spot a medicine and have created rules around when and why we take medicines.

Year 3 The Year 3 children have enjoyed making angels to share their Advent pledges. They have also loved beginning the new English topic of Comics, sharing their knowledge of super heroes.

Year 4 Year 4 have continued to work hard on their multiplication in maths this week. They have begun to look at some different multiplication written strategies. In PE the children have been working on their stamina and strength in Health and Fitness. For RE, the children have been thinking about how God gave us the gift of Jesus. They then thought about the gifts that Jesus has given them.

Year 5 Year 5 have started rehearsing for our Christmas Carol Service to be held in St Anne's Church on Wednesday 11th December at 6pm. Everyone would be welcome to celebrate this advent season. We are all working hard on our swimming and our gymnastics balance routines have suddenly taken-off. In English we have finished biographies and now are looking to at poetry.

Year 6 Year 6 have been thinking this week about 'Expectations' in RE and in particular the expectations placed on Mary in the time leading to the birth of Jesus. The children have also made the final decisions regarding ingredients for their spring rolls next week - we can't wait to see their food creations!


