Curriculum News

Nursery We been listening to the 'Nativity story' in Nursery this week, the children have taken it in turns to act out different parts. We talked to the children about their experiences of going on a long journey, how they thought Mary and joseph felt in the story. If they were to bring a present for a baby what they might bring and if they have had special times in their lives and why were they special.

Reception This week in Reception we have been learning the story of Little Red Riding Hood and have been doing a retell of the story. The children also did their first performance of the Nativity in front of an audience. They did amazingly!

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have continued our English topic on letters. The children have been brilliant writing their own informal letters to their chosen friend/family member. We have also written a very exciting letter addressed to 'King Charles'. We hope he receives our letters! As part of our R.E topic 'Waiting' we have started our Advent preparations.

Year 2 This week the children have been working incredibly hard on their Maths, English and wider curriculum work. In PSHE they have been learning about keeping safe in the home, and also the people in their home, school and community who keep them safe. In RE they have been begun the theme of 'Preparations' by exploring how they prepare for Christmas, and the importance of preparing well. During Science they have been sorting and classifying materials according to their properties. The children's gymnastics skills are developing beautifully, and they can now perform a sequence of 4 movements, linked together smoothly on the floor and apparatus. We are so proud of them!

Year 3 "Advent has hit with a bang in Year 3. We have found out about the first candle of hope and also written letters to Taiwan to tell children at a school there what we are most looking forward to. In Science we have looked at how opaque, transparent and translucent objects create different shadows and in History we have seen how Ormskirk probably began in Viking times when a Viking called Orm built a church on the hill."

Year 5 Have been making amazing progress with the rehearsals for their Carol Concert, that will be held on Wednesday 14th December at 6pm in St Anne's church. Both their singing and their speaking are fantastic.

Year 6 Have been busy learning more about Tsunamis ready to write a newspaper report next week. We've been focusing on Indonesia and how that area of the world is affected by them and devastation that can be caused. We have also looked at the famous artist and zoologist Ernst Haeckel.
