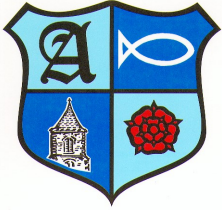

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Curriculum News



Nursery We have been very busy in Nursery this week planting flowers in our Garden, the children have loved learning about gardening and choosing their own flower and carefully putting it in to the space they created. The children have been learning about buds on the trees and have been on a walk to find some, we marked them with ribbons so that we can see how they change over the next few weeks. It has been a lovely week for the children to enjoy lots of outdoor learning.

Reception This week in Reception we have been verbally counting past 20. In English we have been reading 'How to Catch a Star' and we have been writing super sentences to accompany illustrations from the story. In Expressive Art and Design we have been learning about Gaudi and creating our own mosaics.

Year 1 This week we have been planning our retell of Supertato. We have also started our History topic on the Titanic and have been sketching plants and flowers based on our Artist this half term, Van Gogh.

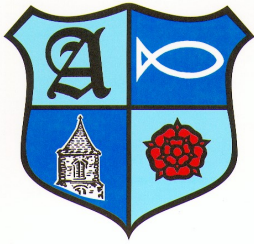
Year 2 This week in Year 2 has been another busy week. St Anne's said a Goodbye on Wednesday to Miss Oates and wished her well in her future. In English, we are still looking at 'The boy who grew dragons'. In Maths, we have moved on to recognising $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$. In D-T today we have been tasting smoothies in preparation for making our own.

Year 3 This week, Year 3 have been continuing to focus on the 'effects of friction' within their Science lessons, experimenting to explore which surfaces have the most friction. They have learnt about the different homes people lived in from the Stone Age up to the Iron Age in History, while in English they have continued to think about what it would have been like to live in the Stone Age.

Year 4 We have enjoyed athletics in PE this week- we have continued to practice handovers for the relay race and looking at some different jumping skills. In Maths, we have been calculating with money and in English we have continued to read our class text 'Race to the Frozen North'. We have completed some research in to Matthew Henson in preparation for writing a non-chronological report about him.

Year 5 In Year 5 we have been learning about gravity, thrust, friction and up thrust (buoyancy in water) and how they interact on boats and planes. We have studied the ancient city states of Greece and how they believed in the motto, "My enemy's neighbour is my friend", so Athens loved Argos, because it was next to Sparta. In PE we have been learning to drive a golf ball and then how to sprint with changes of direction.

Year 6 This week the children have continued their hard work on Detective Fiction - finding inspiration for mystery in famous texts including Sherlock Holmes. In Science, they identified key components of electric circuits & used symbols to show them. We've enjoyed our 2nd sessions of Tag Rugby and Yoga - what a lovely way to end the week!

Good News for Families  **Wednesday 30th April 2025**

1 Enjoy reading the Gospel 

After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples for the third time. The disciples had been out fishing and as soon as they came ashore they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He replied, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Look after my sheep." Then he said to him a third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter said, "Lord, you know everything; you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."

Taken from the Gospel of Sunday 4th May 2025 - John 21:1-19 (the 3rd Sunday of Easter, Year C)

Which words stood out for you in this Gospel, and why? What does the picture make you think about? Enjoy exploring this Wednesday's word, which is **WITNESS**

2 "Dear young people, Jesus is counting on you to be his friends and witnesses to his infinite love." Pope Francis


What was Peter's reply to Jesus' questions? What three things did Jesus tell Peter to do? Peter had denied knowing Jesus three times before the crucifixion. But now Jesus gives Peter the chance to say he loves him three times - preparing Peter to lead the Church. From this point onwards, St Peter's life witnessed to the truth about Jesus. Ask your child what the word 'witness' means to them. Who has recently brought the message of Jesus to your child? Who does your child know to be a great witness for Jesus?

3 St Peter gave witness to what Jesus did and who Jesus really was. Because of his witness, many people came to know and follow Jesus. Through our words, actions and through the power of the Holy Spirit, we too can be God's witnesses, through living our lives the way Jesus shows us. Choose a special way to be Jesus' witnesses - sharing and showing God's love to everyone you meet in this coming week. Perhaps you can: be kind and loving in your simple everyday words and actions; be a peacemaker; pray and ask God to make you a good witness.

Dear Lord Jesus, please help us to be your **witnesses** by our love, so that others will come to know the joy of knowing you. Amen.

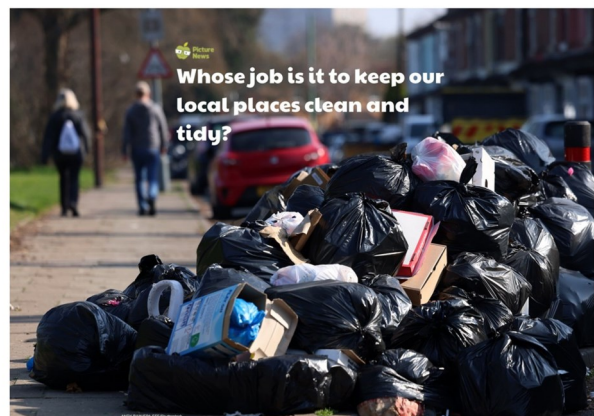

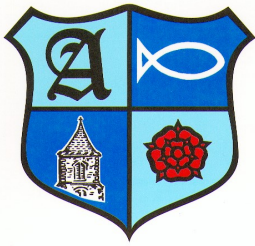

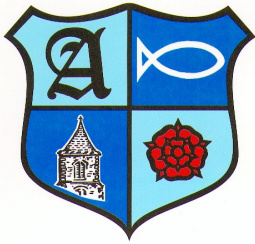
