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In school this week.....

Nursery

The children enjoy lots of role play in Nursery so to further their interests, the children have been challenged to become Chefs this week in our Healthy Cafe. They have shared the roles throughout the week, serving their friends snack, counting out the pieces and sharing their individual preferences with each other. Lots of conversations have been heard between the children. We have also used different fruit and vegetables in our sensory play, using them to make a rainbow. We have challenged the children in Mathematics this week with their subitising skills to 3, it was lots of fun the children also enjoyed the game.



Reception

This week in Reception we have been continuing our work on 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' but we changed what we were hunting for. We used our imagination and wrote descriptive labels. In maths we have been learning about numbers 6, 7 and 8. In RE we have been learning about when Jesus fed the 5000. We broke some bread and shared it with one another. In art we have been learning about the artist Kal Barteski. We created line drawings of polar bears and remembered not to take our pens off! In PE we have continued our dance to the Lion King 'I Just Can't Wait to Be King' using scarves.





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Year 1

This week in English, we have been learning about non-fiction texts through our topic The Great Fire of London. We have been writing our own questions, learning about the conjunction "and", and exploring the key features of a non-fiction text. In Maths, the children have been introduced to non-standard measurement, focusing on length and height. During Jam Coding, we have been bringing our pictures to life by using animation, which has been great fun! In Tennis, we have been practising and improving our drop and catch skills using the tennis racket. We have also been working super hard perfecting our performance of Snow White and can't wait to show you all very soon!



Year 2

Year 2 have had a very busy and productive week! In English, the children have worked incredibly hard writing their own versions of The Pirate Cruncher, and their stories have been brilliant reads, full of imagination. In Maths, we have been exploring grouping and sharing in multiplication and have begun to use the multiplication symbol. In Science, the children looked at fish and how we can classify them. In History, the children created informative posters about Amy Johnson, sharing lots of facts about her life and achievements, while in Geography they compared Australia with the UK. In RE, we looked at the call of the disciples, who the apostles were, and explored the parable of the lost sheep, learning what a parable is. In Computing, the children continued developing their coding skills by adding movement and speech to their sprites. In PE, the children choreographed their own section to add to their final dance piece inspired by Alice in Wonderland.





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Year 3

This week in Year 3 the children have begun their new unit in English, non-chronological reports. The children have read various non-chronological reports on the Romans, Boudica and Roman life to immerse them in what is included in a non-chronological report. The children then learnt how to skim and scan a piece of information and take notes on it, ready for gathering their own information next week. In Maths, the children have been learning about millimetres, centimetres and metres and conversions between them. They also investigated appropriate units of measure when recording the heights and lengths of different objects. In science the children created an investigation into different types of soil. In History the children have continued to learn about the lasting impact the Romans left in Britain. The children then created a podium of the best 3 lasting impacts/influences we have from the Romans.



Year 4

Throughout the week we have been continuing to look at length and perimeter- converting measurements, calculating perimeter and missing lengths. In English we have been writing our non-chronological reports about Matthew Henson and arctic animals. In Science, we have learned about invertebrates and how to classify them. Whilst in the computer suite with Mrs Taylor, we used tinkercad: a 3D design and modelling program, to create the world for our game, learning how to rotate the screen to look from different points of view. Our dances are taking shape in our PE lessons and we are looking forward to performing them to the other class.



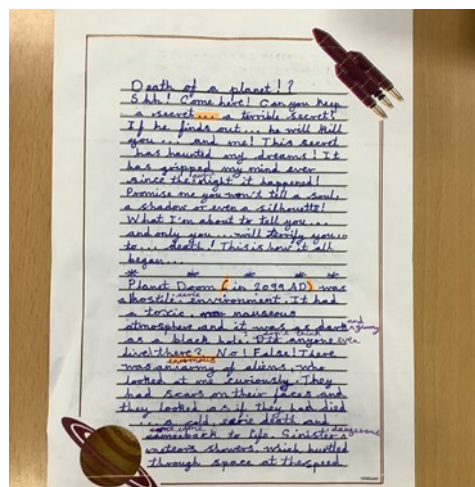


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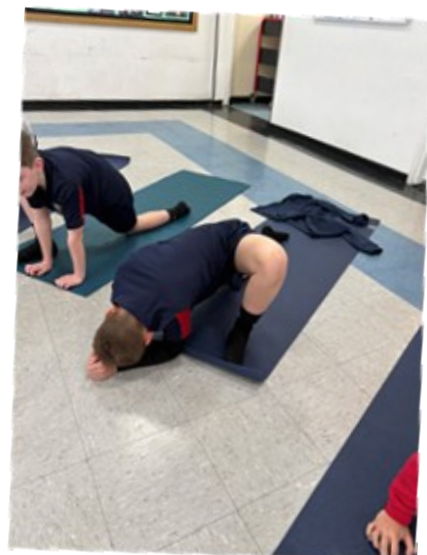
Year 5

Year 5 have been looking at how to multiply fractions and mixed numbers by integers, so you can imagine it has been a hard week for us! We have also been writing science fiction, which has let us run riot with our imaginations - there is nothing more therapeutical than creating our own planetary system. In Science, we have learnt about how we get our 24 hour day and how that impacts on world time zones and in Geography we have learnt to read Ordnance Survey maps with 4 (or even 6) figure grid references. Well done Year 5 for all your learning this week!



Year 6

The children have been focusing on the Anglo Saxons in history this week, where they came from and why they came to Britain. This will lead into the children learning about the battle for the throne during this period. Through our English topic, the children have created new characters who Dorothy will come across on her journey to Oz. For example, a singer who has lost her voice and a goalkeeper who just can't save any goals! The children's enjoyment of their yoga sessions continues to be clear to see - some of the flexibility on show is very impressive!

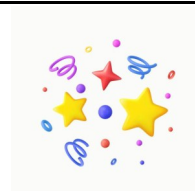
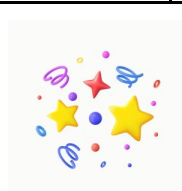
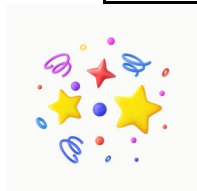
