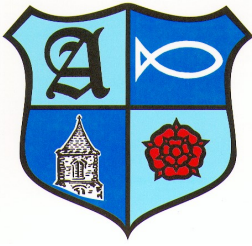

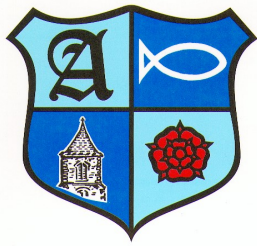

## Curriculum News

**Nursery** We have had a lovely week in Nursery watching the ducklings grow, a special thanks to Archie H and his family for taking such good care of them last weekend. The children have been watching them swim and laughing at their funny antics. Reception kindly let us see the chicks they have had and the children have been talking about the differences that they noticed. The children have enjoyed Easter egg hunts around the School grounds, working in teams to find them and mark them off their checklist, the yummy eggs we got to eat at the end were the best though!

**Reception** This week we have been learning to create and continue repeating patterns in Maths and have been changing parts of Jack and the Beanstalk in English. We have loved having the chicks, we have been caring for them and watching them grow. In RE we have been creating our own Easter gardens.

**Year 1** This week we wrote our recounts on the Easter Performance. We also had a lovely afternoon with our grandparents, who helped us create the finger puppets we designed in DT this half term.

**Year 2** This week is Year 2, we have had a 'roar'some time! We had an amazing Animal Day on Monday, were the children wrote exciting descriptions of their bug hotels, then in afternoon they made some wonderful moving mini-beasts using wheels, axels and chassis.

**Year 3** Year 3 have had an extremely busy week, where the children have performed their Easter Reflection in front of three different audiences sharing it with the school, the parish and most importantly their families. The children performed amazingly, showing off their fantastic talents, while sharing the most important story of all.

**Year 4** Year 4 had a great time at Martin Mere in the glorious weather. The children's behaviour was exceptional and we enjoyed our workshop on 'The Water Cycle'. It was great to be out in the fresh air and lovely sunshine. What a fantastic way to end such a busy half term.

**Year 5** Year 5 have finished our studies of the Amazon Rainforest with a debate on the pros and cons of deforestation and the use of palm oil - did you know that nearly 50% of products on the supermarket shelves use palm oil? We have also been looking at timetables, charts and graphs in Maths, as well as some of us have got on to angles.
