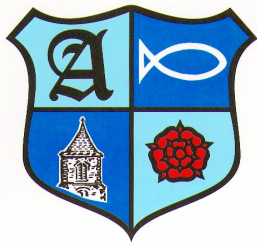

Curriculum News

Nursery We had a visit from some Zoo animals in Nursery, the children were able to hold the animals and learn some information about them. To celebrate World Book Day the children were invited to dress up, we had a lovely array of different animals and enjoyed reading lots of stories. The children have been learning about Aboriginal style Art this week and have displayed wonderful fine motor skills to produce some lovely Art Work.

Reception This week in Reception we have been writing fact files about a T-Rex. We visited Ormskirk Library on Thursday to celebrate World Book Day- we had a wonderful time and we were able to choose a library book to take home. In maths we have been learning about numbers 9 and 10.

Year 1 This week, we have enjoyed celebrating World Book Day and showing off our amazing work for our displays! Also, we have enjoyed designing our own characters to change part of our story 'No-Bot'.

Year 2 This week in Maths, we have started our Mass and Capacity topic and finished our Measuring length . The Children have liked practically finding things that are heavier and lighter within our classroom. In English, We have started writing our own chapter using a different nocturnal animal based on the ' Owl who was afraid of the Dark'. The Children loved celebrating World Book Day, especially when they had the opportunity to talk about their own favourite books. The love of reading in this class has become stronger week by week.

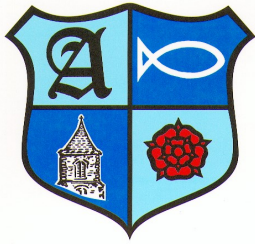
Year 3 This week, Year 3 were very lucky to have a visit from some Edge Hill teacher training students, who brought a wonderful range of games to teach them facts about the history of Ormskirk.

Year 4 Year 4 have enjoyed lots of great lessons this week. For World Book Day we focused on our school text 'The Secret Elephant' and wrote a diary entry as the elephant. In Science, we have been looking at 'States of Matter', thinking about solids, liquids and gases and the processes of evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.

Year 5 Year 5 are studying the life-cycles of a range of mammals, amphibians, birds and insects - it has been fascinating to see how some animals lay soft or hard eggs, whilst others give birth to live young. In the Amazon Rainforest, we have studied indigenous tribes, such as the Yanomami and been fascinated by the fact that some tribes have never had contact with the outside world. In RE we have looked at the reasons why we celebrate Ash Wednesday as a way of turning back to God through Jesus Christ. The photo this week is of some of us valuating our rockets projects.

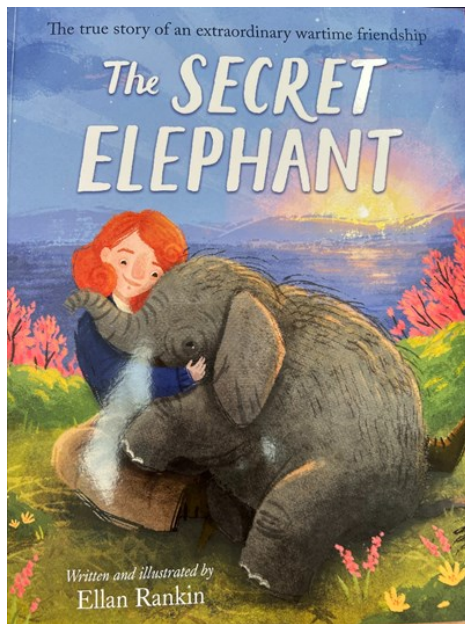

Each class has produced amazing work based on this true story in Belfast Zoo.

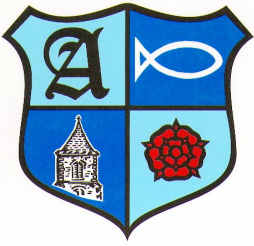

THE WORD Wednesday  **SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL WITH PARENTS & FAMILIES**

Wednesday 5th March 2025

Dear Parents and Carers,

Today is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. This is the day when Catholics throughout the world come together to celebrate Mass and receive ashes on their foreheads to mark the beginning of the Lenten Season.

The season of Lent reminds us of Jesus' 40 days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness, where he grew stronger through resisting various temptations. In this Sunday's Gospel, the tempter makes three suggestions in an effort to divert Jesus from his true mission.

Jesus rejects the temptations, one after another - each time with a word from Scripture, which is the Word of God.

It is part of the human condition to face temptations in life. But the more familiar we become with the Word of God, the more we too can be strengthened to resist temptations and be filled with new life. Enjoy your week and help spread God's love, through **LENT**.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH
Sunday 9th March 2025

 Following his baptism, Jesus went out into the desert for forty days. He was all alone and he ate nothing because he was fasting. Knowing that Jesus would be hungry, the Tempter told him to turn a stone into bread. But Jesus refused and said, "Scripture says, 'No one lives on bread alone.'" Then the Tempter showed him all the kingdoms of the world, promising Jesus all their power and glory if Jesus would worship him rather than God. But Jesus said, "It is written, 'You must worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only!'" Finally, the Tempter took Jesus to the top of the temple and told him to prove he was the Son of God by jumping off, and have God's angels come to save him. But Jesus said, "You must not put the Lord your God to the test." After Jesus had resisted three times, the Tempter left him.
