

Year 1

Year 1 have had a wonderful start to the term. In English, we have begun our exciting new topic all about *Zog*! The children have loved getting to know the story — writing their own questions, making predictions, and using some fantastic adjectives to describe Zog and his adventures. In ICT, the class had lots of fun during their Jam Coding session, using the coding pets to input instructions and watch them move around the room. In Geography, we have started learning about the four countries that make up the United Kingdom and have been identifying their capital cities. The children were very enthusiastic and are already becoming little geography experts!







Year 2

The children have made a fantastic start to the new half term and have come back ready to learn! In English, we began our new topic *Twisted Tales* and focused on *The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig*. The children enjoyed making predictions about the story and asking thoughtful questions to explore the characters and events.

In Maths, we have been working very hard on the tricky concept of adding two 2-digit numbers across a ten. The children have shown great perseverance and are growing in confidence with different strategies. Our new History topic is all about *Ormskirk*. The children are already excited to find out more about our local area and how it has changed over time.

In Religion, we started our second branch, *Prophecy and Promise*. We learned about prophets and their messages from God, focusing on the prophet Isaiah and his scripture about darkness and the great light. The children reflected on his words beautifully and created their own artwork to represent this theme.

Year 3

In year 3 this week the children have been working extremely hard! In English we have started our new unit, Fables and the children have been reading about the hare and the tortoise, identifying the features of the fable. They then wrote a retell of the fable and read them out to the class. In French the children have been learning to count and then used their fantastic French skills to add single digits together. In R.E the children have been recognising and describing the significance of Sunday Mass and making links between Mass and the Creation story.





Year 4

Year 4 have made a great start to the second Autumn half term. We have introduced our new topics which have needed mature and a sensible attitude. We have started to think about the Slave Trade in History and Geography and Apartheid in English. Our new text for English is called "Journey to Jo'burg" and we are looking forward to finding out how the characters solve their dilemma. In PE this week we began our health and fitness topic by measuring our stamina and flexibility. In maths we have begun our multiplication and division topic and will developing our knowledge of our times tables through reasoning and problem solving.

Year 5

This week Year 5 have been exploring historical facts about The Islamic Golden Age and in particular the round city of Baghdad 700AD. The children have been learning new key words to expand their historical vocabulary while expanding their geographical knowledge of the countries surrounding Baghdad. Originally built by the Abbasid family in 762 AD, Baghdad quickly became the world centre for learning

and culture.



Year 6

Year 6 have enjoyed the start to the new half term after a good rest! We have dived straight into our study of Macbeth, we think the children are really going to enjoy this juicy English topic! Some Year 6 pupils were able to visit a local care home this week, both to share their thoughtful poetry but also just to chat to the residents. The children were a great representation of our school and we were very proud of them. We've had the atlases out to begin 'Our Word' in Geography and enjoyed researching a variety of countries around the world. In PE this week, we have begun out gymnastics topic with our West Lancs

Sports coach.


