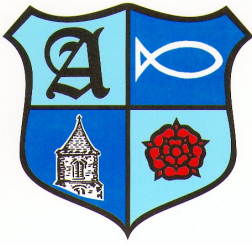

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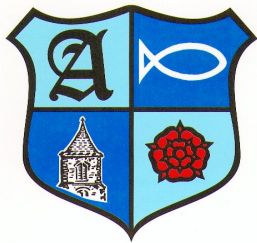

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Curriculum News

Nursery The children have been learning about the lifecycle of a plant, we have discussed the different stages and have learnt lots of new vocabulary. To support our learning we have planted our own sunflower seeds ready to take home and have made a cress caterpillar! The Giggle tots have enjoyed pretending to 'catch' worms using tweezers.

Reception This week in Reception we have been learning to add two amounts together. We have retelling the story of 'How to Catch a Star' and we have been learning about the Holy Spirit in RE.

Year 1 This week, we have been expressing our creativity by designing our own pieces of artwork to show what the Holy Spirit means to us. We've also been learning about the story of the Titanic, carefully ordering key events in chronological order to better understand this historic event.

Year 2 In Year 2 this week, we have been continuing recognising and finding fractions to $\frac{3}{4}$. In English, we have been doing lots of work using our adjectives to describe 'The Boy who Grew Dragons'. The children are working so hard to learn all their lines for the Year 2 play- Thank you to all parents for supporting them!

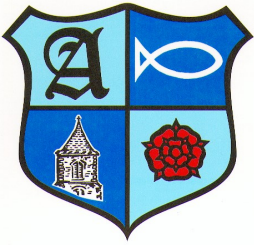
Year 3 Year 3 have learnt about VE day and Winston Churchill and his role in WW2. The children painted Union Jacks and created portraits of Winston Churchill. The children have also been adding and subtracting fractions. In PE we have been adding to our dance performances related to the Stone Age.

Year 4 We have had a very interesting week this week. We have celebrated VE day in class, talking about what life was like during World War 2, thinking about the sacrifices people made, looking at how Liverpool was affected during the Blitz and then creating some artwork for our hall display. Mrs Elwill shared her Grandad's photographs and medals from his time serving in the army.

Year 5 Year 5 celebrated with the rest of the country VE Day this week - we found out what the first VE Day was all about and how it was a real cause for celebration as grandparents, great grandparents and uncles came home after 6 long years of war. We can't wait to celebrate as a school on Tuesday 20th May. We will be dressing up as doctors, nurses, soldiers, people from the Home Guard, workers, anything from 1945.

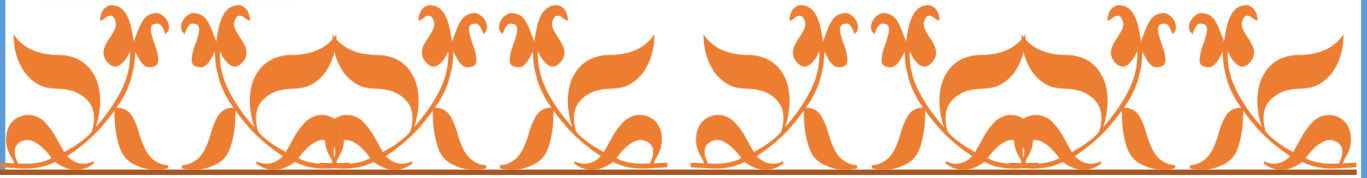
