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Curriculum News

Nursery In nursery we have been investigating different mini beasts! We have shared our own knowledge with our friends and learnt some new facts too! Down in Willow Woods we discovered lots of mini beasts hiding. We have created our own mini beasts and read lots of stories together.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we started our new English topic 'Classic Stories' and read 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children have worked super hard to recall facts and recognise and describe how the farmer felt in the story. In science we are enjoying learning all about different plants and we are so excited to plant our mystery seed over the next few weeks!

Year 2 Another super, hard working week in Year 2! The children have been innovating their own versions of 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons' creating new characters, mythical creatures, problems, and enemies!! In Maths the children have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10 - a really tricky skill - but they have been brilliant! In the wider curriculum, the children have continued to be little scientists - planting sunflowers, growing broad beans and observing the changes. Miss Banks, Mrs Preston & Mrs Walsh are so proud of you!

Year 3 The weeks are flying! Class 7 & 8 have worked so hard again this week, focusing on fractions, cave paintings and volcanoes. They also managed to start 2 after school clubs too!

Year 4 This week, we have continued our study of the River Nile. We used a map to take a closer look at Egypt, before identifying physical and human features of the country. We then researched the features and plotted them on the map.

Year 5 Year 5 have been working on understanding timetables and identifying lengths of time. We've also been creating fantastic action text, with direct speech included.

Year 6 This week in Year 6 we have begun to construct our rollercoaster, we are working well in our groups.
