Dear Parents

We are all well aware that Christmas 2020 will not be celebrated as we have known in the past. None-the-less, since we have learnt to adapt to situations over the past months, I hope that Christmas will still be an opportunity for you and your families to gather and celebrate this great feast with joy.

Government restrictions mean that the number of people allowed in church for Mass is limited so Masses will be simpler than is usual for this great celebration. Christmas Masses in St Anne's will be as follows:

Christmas Eve: 5pm and 9pm.

Christmas Day: 10am.

You will need to **book tickets** in advance in order to come to Mass. Full details on how to apply for tickets can be found in the bulletin on St Anne's parish web site, on Facebook and in the printed copies of the parish bulletin. However, there are only a very few places remaining for the 5pm Mass.

These three Masses will be live streamed so you can join us in church from your homes. It's a good second - best way to participate in our Christmas services.

Also, I shall be celebrating a **Mass which will be recorded** and available to view on Facebook from 6pm Christmas Eve onwards. The Children's Liturgy Team will help prepare the Mass with young children in mind. *Some of the children will be (safely) acting out the Gospel of the Nativity*

The Church celebrates Christmas until the feast of the Epiphany, 6 January. I hope you might have an opportunity to visit St Anne's at some stage and if the church is not open you will be able to say a prayer by our new outdoor crib (which I hope will be set up by Christmas) or you can visit the new statue of Our Lady of Lourdes round the corner of the main church door.

Key Messages

Covid19

The key messages to try to reduce the spread of Covid-19 are:

Ensuring good hand washing routines using soap and hot water.

Adults and children to maintain a 2 metre distance wherever possible.

Parents and children not to gather at the start or end of the day on the school grounds.

Headlice and Threadworm

It is very common in schools for children to have head lice. It is sensible for all parents/carers to continually check their child's head for lice and use the correct treatments as required. Please also check for threadworms as this is also common in children. Please seek medical advice as required.
