**Nursery** In Nursery we have been continuing to look at new life in Spring. We have been excitedly observing the growth of the different vegetables that are now planted and labelled in our Garden. we have also sown wild flower seeds. **Reception** This week in Reception we have been continuing to write about and recall the story of Jack and the Beanstalk using our talk for write.
