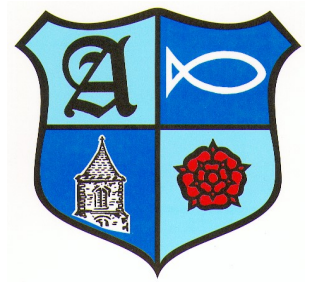


**Curriculum News**

- Reception** This week we have started our 'people who help us' topic. We have been learning about how doctors, nurses and paramedics help people when they are sick or injured. We also learnt why people wear a poppy on Remembrance Day and were very respectful during our minute silence.
- Year 1** This week we have planned and written our own endings to the story of "Zog" using wow adjectives and repeated phrases. We have loved celebrating Maths Week and completed number gym challenges- keeping healthy with a maths theme- as well as number hunts both in class and outside on the playground!
- Year 2** This week we have been reading the adventures of Katie Morag and discovering lots about the characters on the Isle of Struay. In Maths we have been using arrays to solve multiplication calculations. On Wednesday we respectfully remembered soldiers past and present by making beautiful poppy field paintings.
- Year 3** This week in Year 3 we have continued our work on our Promises topic in RE focusing on aspects of Baptism. The children also produced some lovely art work to mark Remembrance Day.

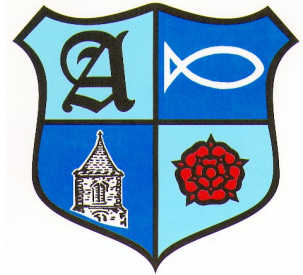
