## **Curriculum News**

- **Reception** This week we have been learning about the Fire Service and how they help us. We have loved mark making fires with chalk on the ground in outdoor play, and putting them out by washing them off with water.
- Year 1 This week, even at home, we have continued to explore the countries of the United Kingdom and recorded a range of facts about the capital city of London. We have worked very hard developing our computer skills - by completing our phonics and maths work as well as creating pictograms on Purple Mash!
- Year 2 This week we have been planning and writing the story of Katie Morag and the Big Boy Cousins independently. They get up to lots of mischief! Poor Grannie Island!
  In Maths, we have been making, sorting, describing and identifying 2D shapes this week. Watch out for some 3D fun next week!

# Key Messages

#### Headlice and Threadworm

It is very common in schools for children to have <u>head lice</u>. It is sensible for all parents/carers to continually check their child's head for lice and use the correct treatments as required.

Please also check for <u>threadworms</u> as this is also common in children. Please seek medical advice as required.

Covid19

#### The key messages to try to reduce the spread of Covid-19 are:

Ensuring good hand washing routines using soap and hot water.

Adults and children to maintain a 2 metre distance wherever possible.

Parents and children not to gather at the start or end of the day on the school grounds.
