This term the children from Year 5-6 will be studying the three themes of Domestic Church (Family), Baptism and Confirmation (Belonging) and Advent and Christmas (Loving). Each class will approach the themes through different topics. The children will also spend a week studying Hanukkah.

Nursery, Reception and Year 1-4 will be studying the new R.E.D curriculum that covers; Creation and Covenant and Prophecy and Promise.

CREATION AND COVENANT

(2nd September-23rd October)

Early Years	CREATION AND COVENANT - the whole of creation shows God love for us.
Year 1	CREATION AND COVENANT - Revelation – how do people know about God?
Year 2	CREATION AND COVENANT - the story of Noah and God's promise.
Year 3	CREATION AND COVENANT - revisit the story of creation and it happens through the Word and Spirit.
Year 4	CREATION AND COVENANT - God's covenant with Abraham is the foundation of the faith of the people of the Old and New Testaments: Judaism and Christianity

DOMESTIC CHURCH – FAMILY

(2nd September – 26th September)

Year 5	OURSELVES - Created in the image and likeness of God
Year 6	LOVING - God who never stops loving

Pupils will study various aspects of Hanukkah for one week. Ask them what they have been learning about.
