Baptism/Confirmation focus on the sacraments of the gift of God's life and friendship.

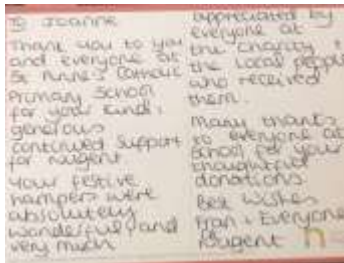
Here are the Y1 children role playing a baptism.

The first half of the Spring Term was a period of blended learning, but the importance of the children's Religious Education remained paramount. Children in school and at home continued their weekly curriculum lessons and produced some wonderful work on the themes of:

Community:

the journey of faith, in care for one another.

Relating:

focusing on the invitation to know Jesus, and to live in communion with him.

Giving:

Lent/Easter focusing on Jesus' self-giving that raised him to new life.

Sadly, we were unable to celebrate Easter with our friends and wider school family, but this did not deter us! The Y3 children told the story of Jesus'

journey to the cross in a beautiful on-line presentation.

We also joined together with our friends at St Anne's Children's Liturgy group to produce a beautiful Easter garden for families to visit, pray and remember the joy of the risen Jesus.



The three Summer themes are developed in the light of an understanding of the work of the Holy Spirit.

Serving:

Pentecost focuses on the mission of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Inter-Relating:

Reconciliation focuses on the love, compassion and forgiveness of God the Father revealed in Jesus.
