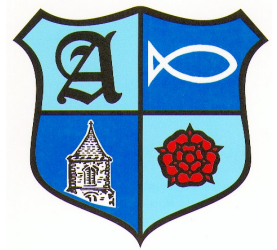

This theme is about ...

Our Environment, Weather and Recycling

Communication & Language

- We will make comments about what we have heard and ask questions to clarify our understanding;
- We will offer our own ideas, using recently introduced vocabulary.
- We will offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary
- We will express our ideas and feelings about our experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present, and future tenses and making use of conjunctions.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- We will know how to self regulate and show an understanding of our own feelings and those of others.
- We will set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what we want and control our immediate impulses when appropriate.
- We will show an ability to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions.
- We will be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.
- We will work and play cooperatively and take turns with others and form positive attachments to adults and friendships with peers.

Understanding the World

Our School Environment

- We will draw information from a simple map and use programme beebots.
- We will recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.
- We will describe our immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.
- We will read all about who Greta Thunberg is and what she has done.
- We will know that the environment and living things are influenced by human activity and actions people do to help maintain

Physical Development

Athletics and Gymnastics

- We will develop overall body-strength, balance, co-ordination and agility.
- We will develop the overall body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility needed to engage successfully with future physical education sessions
- We will revise and refine the fundamental movement skills they have already acquired: - rolling - crawling - walking - jumping - running - hopping, skipping, throwing and climbing.

Maths

- We will explore shape.
- We will continue to explore even and odd.
- We will recap doubles.
- We will identify units of repeating patterns.
- We will explore and create our own pattern rules and explore position.

Expressive Arts & Design

- We will create 'Recycled Art' out of the recycled materials we have collected.
- We will safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.
- We will share our creations, explaining the process we have used.
- We will explore different materials freely, to develop our ideas about how to use them and what to make to create a bee bot map.
- We will invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and our teachers.
- We will sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs each day.
- In Music our topic is called Big Band.

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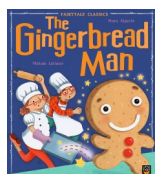
'Dialogue and Encounter'

Phonics

We continue to consolidate Phase 3/4 sounds. A little practise each night will help your child become more confident recognising them in reading and using them in writing. Please continue to practise reading Phase 3/4 tricky words.

Key Vocabulary

Characters- is someone in a story

Setting – where the story is based (usually a place)

Story – usually has a beginning, middle and end

Maths—Grouping, sharing, equally, patterns, repeating, mapping, position.

Environment- the circumstances, objects, or conditions by which one is surrounded.

Map-symbolic representation of selected characteristics of a place, usually drawn on a flat surface

Recycling– making rubbish into something new

Seasons– Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter

Painting: Primary (colour), Light, Dark, Thick, Thin, Tone, Warm, Cold, Shade e.g. different shades of red, green, blue, yellow, Bright.

Primary Colour- Red, yellow, and blue. All of the other colours can be made from these three.

Music- a group of sounds that people have arranged in a meaningful way

Musical instrument- an object that can be used to produce music

Band-a group of people

Sound- is made up of vibrations that we can hear

Shake- to move from side to side

Tap- to hit something gently

Bang- to hit something hard

Strum- brushing the strings with your hands

Jingle- a light clinking sound

Tempo- the speed of the music (Fast or Slow)

Dynamic- the volume of the music (Loud or Quiet)

Pitch- how high or low a sound is

Orchestra- A group of people playing instruments, sometimes classical music.

Rhythm- A pattern of long and short notes.

Beat- The heartbeat of the music. Sometimes called the pulse.

Conductor- Someone who directs the performance of an Orchestra or Choir .

Ambitious Vocabulary

Mulligrub- sad or in a bad mood.

Ugglesome-Horrible and scary.

Quibble- having an argument about something that doesn't really matter.

Courageous- standing up for what you know is right

Optimistic- to see the positive side of things

Elaborate- made or done with great care/detail

Enquired- to request information

Demolish-to completely destroy
