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In school this week.....

Nursery

We have continued to enjoy caring for the ducklings in Nursery. The children have loved cuddling them and watching them swim. This week, we have also been learning about a different life cycle and have been exploring the life cycle of a frog, learning lots of new topic related vocabulary along the way. The children have enjoyed listening to the story *The Perfect Ribbit*, which links beautifully to our discussions about how we are all unique. With the sunshine making an appearance, we have had lots of fun outdoors, playing a variety of games and enjoying large scale mark making.



Reception

This week in Reception we have been reading 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers, the children have been retelling the story by learning actions. They have used these actions to write a beautiful retelling of the beginning of the story. We have remembered capital letters, fingers spaces and full stops! In maths we have been verbally counting beyond 20. We are getting so confident with this now. In RE we have been learning about the Holy Spirit and how it is like the wind. Here are some photos of us exploring the wind and making our own pin wheels.





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Year 1

This week in Year 1, the children have worked incredibly hard across all areas of learning. In English, they are becoming more confident in using capital letters and full stops correctly when writing sentences. In Art, the children created observational drawings of plants using magnifying glasses. They carefully studied what they could see, focusing on texture and the finer details to make their drawings as accurate as possible. In History, the children designed informative posters about the features on board the Titanic, showing great enthusiasm and creativity. During Jam Coding, the children continued learning about online safety, understanding the importance of keeping personal information secure. In Maths, the children learn how to share objects fairly into different groups.



Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have been very busy across all of our subjects. In English and Grammar, we have been learning about suffixes and exploring key words and phrases from our class novel, *The Boy Who Grew Dragons*. We focused on the adjectives used to describe Flicker and then created our own descriptions using exciting and creative adjectives. In Maths, we continued our work on fractions and wholes. In History, we learned about Edith Cavell and created a timeline of her life, helping us understand the important events she experienced and her contribution to history. In RE, we retold the story of the conversion of Saul and discussed how people from different religions and communities pray in different ways. We explored how prayer can be an important part of people's beliefs and daily lives. During PSHE, we explored what race means and discussed this in relation to society today. We talked about how our differences are what make each of us unique and special. We have also begun preparing for our class play based on *The Boy Who Grew Dragons*, and the children are very excited to get started with rehearsals. In PE, we continued developing our skills in athletics and gymnastics.





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Year 3

This week in year 3 the children have worked incredibly hard. In design technology the children have learned and practiced sewing on buttons ready to start making their bags next week. In French the children have been learning to have a conversation discussing transport. In R.E the children have been learning about the Holy Trinity and the different representations of it.



Year 4

We have had another very busy week this week. The children have worked incredibly hard on their assessments in Reading, Maths and GPS and we are very proud of them. We have been very lucky to have volunteers in to support the children with sewing and a couple of teddy bears have already been completed- we are looking forward to seeing more creations completed. In Science, we had fun using instruments to work out how sound was created in different ways and began to talk about sound waves and how sound reaches our ears. In Tennis, we practised volleys and rallies and in Athletics we practised some different throws.



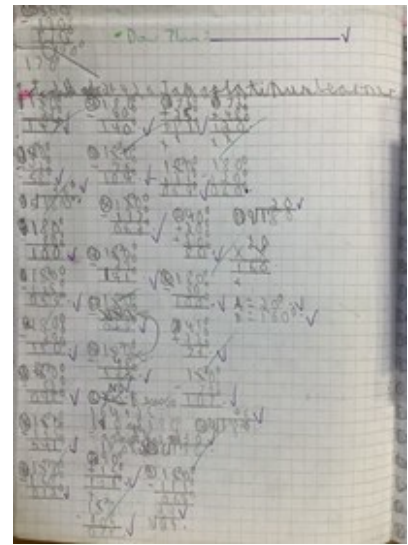


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Year 5

Year 5 have taken to boxercise like a child to a Maccies! We have devoured it! Jabs, hooks and uppercuts have been perfected! What great fun! In English, we are analysing authorial intention and the use of words in Michael Morpurgo books and in Maths we have been brilliant at coordinates, though we found translation hard. In Science we have learnt about gravity and how it is 9.7 metres per second squared and how all things fall at the same rate, regardless of weight, if they are the same size.



Year 6

Year 6 have been getting to grips with their detective fiction topic, creating outlandish detectives who will play a key role in their writing. In RE, they have been writing from the perspective of the witnesses of Jesus and his resurrection, they have been both very spiritual and detailed. The children have also been working together to solve angle problems, using their knowledge of half and full turns, straight lines and protractors. The children have been continuing to work SO hard in the final countdown towards their SATs - we're so proud of them!

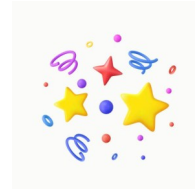

The money raised for the wildflower/ sensory garden was £352. Thank you for wearing blue and green on Earth Day!

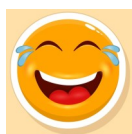
