<u>'Galilee to Jerusalem'</u>

"Loving God In All We Do."



The 'Galilee to Jerusalem' topic is about ...

During this topic, the children will be introduced to the miracles of Jesus and how they expressed his love for all people. They will explore Jesus' parables to show the choices people must make to accept his invitation to the kingdom.

In Science, they explore how we can identify and classify rocks and fossils in Science. In History, they will learn about the Romans, the great explorers of the past. They will build on their knowledge and understanding from Year 2, as well as the historical vocabulary they have already learnt this year. In Design Technology they will explore how to make structures by creating Roman chariots.

Prior learning

- How to write stories in the style of Jonny Duddle (English).
- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they
 are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the
 basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how
 they depend on each other (Science).
- How to write non chronological reports about the life and contributions of Amy Johnson (English).
- How to ask and answer questions about the past through observing and handling a range of sources. (History).

Our current learning

- To describe some aspects of the Roman Empire and recognise its impact on Britain.
- To discuss some historical events, issues, connections and changes.
- To compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- To describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.
- To recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

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RΕ

This half term the children will learn about the significance of the visit of the Magi and the deeper meanings of the gifts they bring, helping them understand what these gifts reveal about Jesus. They will explore what the kingdom of God is, gaining insight through Jesus' miracles and parables that illustrate his compassion and the nature of the kingdom. They will examine two of Jesus' parables and discuss how they reveal the values of God's kingdom. Additionally, they will learn the Our Father prayer and connect its meaning to building the kingdom of God.

Wider curriculum learning

In English, the children will be writing Non Chronological Reports about the Romans. They will also be introduced to and apply the features of Diaries to their own writing.

In Maths, they will continue to focus on developing their multiplication and division skills, with a big focus on developing their recall of the times tables. They will be measuring lengths and perimeters, measuring in mm, cm and m.

In PE, the children will be taking part in a term long 'Health and Fitness' programme run by WLSP. They will also be attending swimming lessons at Park Pool.

In French, the children will be introduced to the adjectives of colour, size and shape and use phrases to describe objects.

In Music, the children will be focusing on Chinese pentatonic scales.

In Computing, the children will consolidate an understanding of how a computer works .


In PHSE, they will be focusing on describing how friendships are made, how they make us feel happy and safe and describing how to repair a relationship.
