'Animal Kingdom'

"Loving God In All We Do."



The 'Animal Kingdom' topic is about ...

In Science, the children will name and identify the common features of animals. They will group animals into their classification groups and recognise their key characteristics. Pupils will also develop their observational skills by comparing similarities and differences.

In Design Technology, pupils will investigate how puppets are made and select appropriate materials to create a puppet using a template. They will learn how to join fabric using a running stitch.

Prior learning

- ◆ Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants
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- ◆ Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live
- ◆ Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense

Our current learning

- ◆ Identify and name a variety of common animals and talk about their diets e.g. herbivore.
- ◆ Describe, compare and group animals according to their features, recognising difference in structures
- ◆ Identify and classify, grouping together animals according to their different features.

Our Desert to Garden unit introduces Lent as a time of preparation for Easter. The children will learn about Jesus' final week, his death, and resurrection. Through stories, prayers, and activities, they will explore the themes of forgiveness and love, understanding that Easter is about Jesus' victory over death.

Wider curriculum learning

Our Geography focus will be the location of hot and cold areas of the world. The children will learn how to identify hot and cold places by looking at maps. They will focus on identifying where the Arctic is located and identify the animals that live in the Arctic.

The children will continue to learn about seasonal changes and they will observe and describe the weather associated with spring.


In Maths, the children will learn about the value of numbers up to 50. We will also be learning about measurement (volume and mass).

In PSHE, this half term will continue our theme of Relationships: families and friendships, safe relationships and respecting ourselves and others.


