The 'Animal Kingdom' topic is about ...

In Science, the children will name and identify the common features of animals. They will group animals into their classification groups and be able to recognise their characteristics. They will begin to use their observational skills to compare similarities and differences.

For Design Technology, pupils will investigate how puppets are made and select materials to create a puppet using a template. They will join the fabric by using a running stitch.

Prior learning

- Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants

- Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live

Our current learning

- Identify and name a variety of common animals and talk about their diets e.g. herbivore.
- Describe, compare and group animals according to their features, recognising difference in structures
- Identify and classify, grouping together animals according to their different features.

In Maths, the children will learning about the value of numbers up to 50. We will also be learning measurements (length and height) and (volume and mass).


In PSHE, this half term will continue our theme of Relationships: families and friendships, safe relationships and respecting ourselves and others.
