The 'Animal Kingdom topic is about ...

The children will be learning about 'Living things and their Habitats' through our English and Science topics. The topic will focus on many different animals and their habitats. There will be opportunities for extensive research on a chosen animal and creation of an information booklet using facts and knowledge learnt. The second English topic is based on' The Eye of the Wolf' which tells the stories of the dangers that humans impose on animals. In PSHE, the importance of looking after an animal will also be taught though Freddie who is a Cavapoo.

Prior learning

- Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.
- Compare and contrast and begin to consider the relationships between skeletons of humans and other animals
- Identifying and classifying- Record similarities and differences

Our current learning

- How to recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.
- Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.
- Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.
- How to use and make identification keys for plants and animals
- Make decisions about which information to use from a wide range of sources and make decisions about how to present

In Art, the children will create a sculpture of a bird's nest using a variety of natural resources and based on the work of sculpture Marcus Coates.


In Computing, the children will use online software for documents, presentations, forms and spreadsheets and using software to work collaboratively with others.
