The 'We are Scientists' topic is about ...

During this topic the children will be learning about rocks and being scientists like the great Mary Anning! Our focus will be the great scientists of the past and what they have found out the rock system.

The children will also be studying the Stone Age through History, Art and English.

Using their rock knowledge children will also be delving into the plate tectonic system which results in the creation of volcanoes and earthquakes.

What we already know...

- Pompeii was destroyed by the famous volcano called Vesuvius in 79AD.
- There are different types of rocks.
- Rocks can be found on mountains.

By the end of the topic we will know ...

- Children will compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.
- Recognise that rocks and soils can feel and look different.
- Recognise that rocks and soils can be different in different places/environments.

Vocabulary

Rocks, minerals, soils, igneous, sedimentary, metamorphic, observe, explain, describe, sequence.

Geography

Lava, crater, magma, ash cloud, magma chamber, lava flow, plinian eruption, earthquake, volcano, trench, ring of fire.

History

Stone Age, cave painting, chronology, Neolithic, mesolithic paleolithic, farming, tools.

Music

Rock and Roll, performance, composition, evaluation, Elvis.
